**Outstanding Club Bulletin/Newsletter** – This will be judged by members of the Executive Committee of the Cabinet. First Place Awards will be given in each group.

**Outstanding Use of Social Media** – This will be judged by members of the Executive Committee of the Cabinet – First Place Awards will be given in each group.

**Outstanding Club Website & Use of that Website** – This will be judged by members of the Executive Committee of the Cabinet – First Place Awards will be given in each group.

**Outstanding Vision Programming** – Based on all around Vision Program of the Club. (Purchase of eye glasses, collection of used eye glasses, Vision Screening, etc.) This will be judged by members of the Executive Committee of the Cabinet – First Place Awards will be given in each group.

**Outstanding Hearing Programming** – Based on all around Hearing Program of the Club. (Purchase of Hearing Aids, Batteries, Testing, etc.) This will be judged by members of the Executive Committee of the Cabinet –First Place Awards will be given in each group.

**Overall Service to Your Community Award** – Based on all around Community Service Program. Information will come from Awards Checklist for 5 Star and Club Excellence Awards. First and Second Place Awards will be presented in each group.

# **COMMITTEE REPORTS** Lions RAP (Reading Action Program)

FACT: 2/3 of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of 4th grade will end up in jail or on welfare.

FACT: 1 in 4 children in America grow up without learning how to read.

FACT: Nearly 85% of the juveniles who face trial in the juvenile court system are functionally illiterate, proving that there is a close relationship between illiteracy and crime. More than 60% of all inmates are functionally illiterate.



In 2012, International President Wayne Madden began the Lions Reading Action Program to improve literacy around the world. In 2013, under the guidance of International President Barry Palmer, it was decided to extend the Lions RAP for an additional 10 years. Every Lions club is encouraged to have an active Reading Action Program in their communities.

How can we do this? A good start is to download the RAP Planning Guide from the LCI website, lonsclubs.org. Simply type RAP in the search box to find the document. It takes you through a process to direct your efforts.

Some ideas for projects include developing a pre-school reading program, perhaps working with your local library. Another is to supply backpacks and school supplies to children in need. For the visually impaired, we can supply Braille books, or books on tape. We can also tutor adults in reading, math, or science. In the near future, include books in your Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets you distribute. (61% of low income families have no books at home to read.) The possibilities are limitless.

# **COMMITTEE REPORTS CONTINUED**



Lions: Please remember that all Lions Clubs, Districts and Multiple Districts that have annual gross receipts less than \$50,000 and do not have to file Form 990 or 990-EZ, must file the <u>e-Postcard</u> (also known as 990-N). Please note that this is an IRS requirement. Please refer to the following chart regarding annual filing requirements:

2010 Tax Year (Filed in 2011 and later)	Form to File
Gross receipts normally less than \$50,000	990-N
Gross receipts greater than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000, and Total As- sets less than \$500,000	990-EZ or 990
Gross receipts greater than \$200,000 or Total assets greater than \$500,000	990

The e-Postcard is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions Clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1 - June 30, and the e-Postcard will be due by <u>November 15th</u> each year. Please note that *an organization cannot request an extension for filing the Form 990-N*.

If you do not file, you risk losing your tax-exempt status. Any Lions Club that fails to meet its annual reporting requirement for three consecutive years automatically loses its tax exempt status under the new law. A club may get reinstated if they complete an <u>application</u> for recognition of exemption even if they originally fell under a group exemption.

Every Club and/or District must have an employer identification number (EIN), even if it will not have employees. The EIN is a unique number that identifies the organization to the Internal Revenue Service. To apply for an EIN, you should obtain a Form SS-4 and its Instructions from the IRS. You may also apply for an <u>EIN online</u>, by telephone (1-800-829-4933), or by fax (fax number at the location accepting applications from your state). It is important that the Clubs and Districts are using the correct EIN for their annual filing.

For frequently asked questions about tax issues and regulations affecting Lions clubs and leadership, go to the Lions Tax FAQ. Go to www.irs.gov/eo for complete details and while you're there sign up for Exempt Organization's free email newsletter, EO Update, to receive up-to-date information posted on the charity pages of irs.gov.

**Obituary for PDG James L. "Jim" McCarty** Past District Governor 22-B 1988-1989, Betterton-Still Pond Lions Club. Upon moving to Delaware he joined the Clayton Lions Club.

James L. "Jim" McCarty also recognized as McCarthy, of Smyrna, DE, died on Saturday, September 19, 2015 at Compass Regional Hospice Center in Centreville, MD. He was 84.

Jim was born and raised in West Baltimore, MD and attended St. Martins School. In 1947, he worked at Baltimore Stationary as a delivery boy and stock clerk. He joined the United States Navy in 1950, and served 4 years on the Destroyer, U.S.S. Stoddard, DD566, while stationed in Boston, Mass. He married and had five children. He was a licensed plumber for 15 years in Massachusetts as well as the Baltimore and the Catonsville Maryland area. Due to a bad back, he made a transition to banking and joined the Provident Savings bank in Baltimore, when he moved to the Eastern Shore of Maryland. He joined the Chestertown Bank of Maryland as a collection manager and security officer for over 22 years. He retired in 1992 and moved to Delaware. While living in Smyrna, he worked for Acme in numerous stores as a bagger and mostly a cashier. Jim was a 32nd degree mason as well as a Past District Governor of the International Association of Lions Clubs representing Lions District 22-B. Lion Jim worked to prevent drug usage in the local schools as well as the communities on the Eastern Shore for a number of years. He was awarded numerous citations and awards for his work with the Lions. Jim was recognized by his peers as a Melvin Jones Fellow and a Ralph Helm Fellow as well as a 100% District Governor. He was awarded the International Presidents Medal for his Humanitarian Service to the Association and was made a Life member of the Delaware Eye Bank as well as Lions International. In addition to his father, Thomas John" Mac" McCarty and his stepmother Christine R. McCarty, Jim is also predeceased by a son, James W. McCarthy. He is survived by three daughters, Linda Anne Pistone, Deborah Cagnina-Fong and Susan Joan Hennessey; one son, Thomas John McCarty, II, eleven grandchildren, fourteen great grandchildren and his dearest friend, Jeanne Giebel.

#### Funeral services will be held on Tuesday, September 22, 2015 at 7:30 pm at Fellows Family Funeral Home 370 W. Cypress St. Millington, MD, where friends and family may call after 6:30pm.


