EXPERIENCE THE JOY OF SERVICE HAPPY HOLIDAYS

Season's greetings, Lions of District 22-B, family, and friends. I wish all of you a joyous holiday season in whatever way you choose to celebrate and a most happy new year.

One of the best parts of being your District Governor is being able to visit each club and learning of all the activities you are doing both in your communities and collectively for our nation and indeed the world. I can see many ways you are bring joy to people in our communities and can see you experiencing the joy of service as you give of yourselves.

Several of our clubs have taken poinsettias or other gifts to nursing or assisted living facilities. I know from personal experience how much it means to receive such a gift from an anonymous donor back home. It brings a bit of joy to them and allows us to once again experience the joy of service.

At the end of the year, many of us send some of our discretionary funds to our favorite charities. It both helps our communities as well as our tax forms next year. As many of you know, my extra funds are now going to the Lions Low Vision Rehabilitation Network Foundation (LOVRNET). This organization, an offshoot of our Lions Vision Research Foundation, is designed to help people with low vision make the best use of the vision they have. As our population gets older, more and more of us are facing these conditions. I encourage you to go to the LOVRNET website, www.lovrnet.org, and learn about the work being done there. 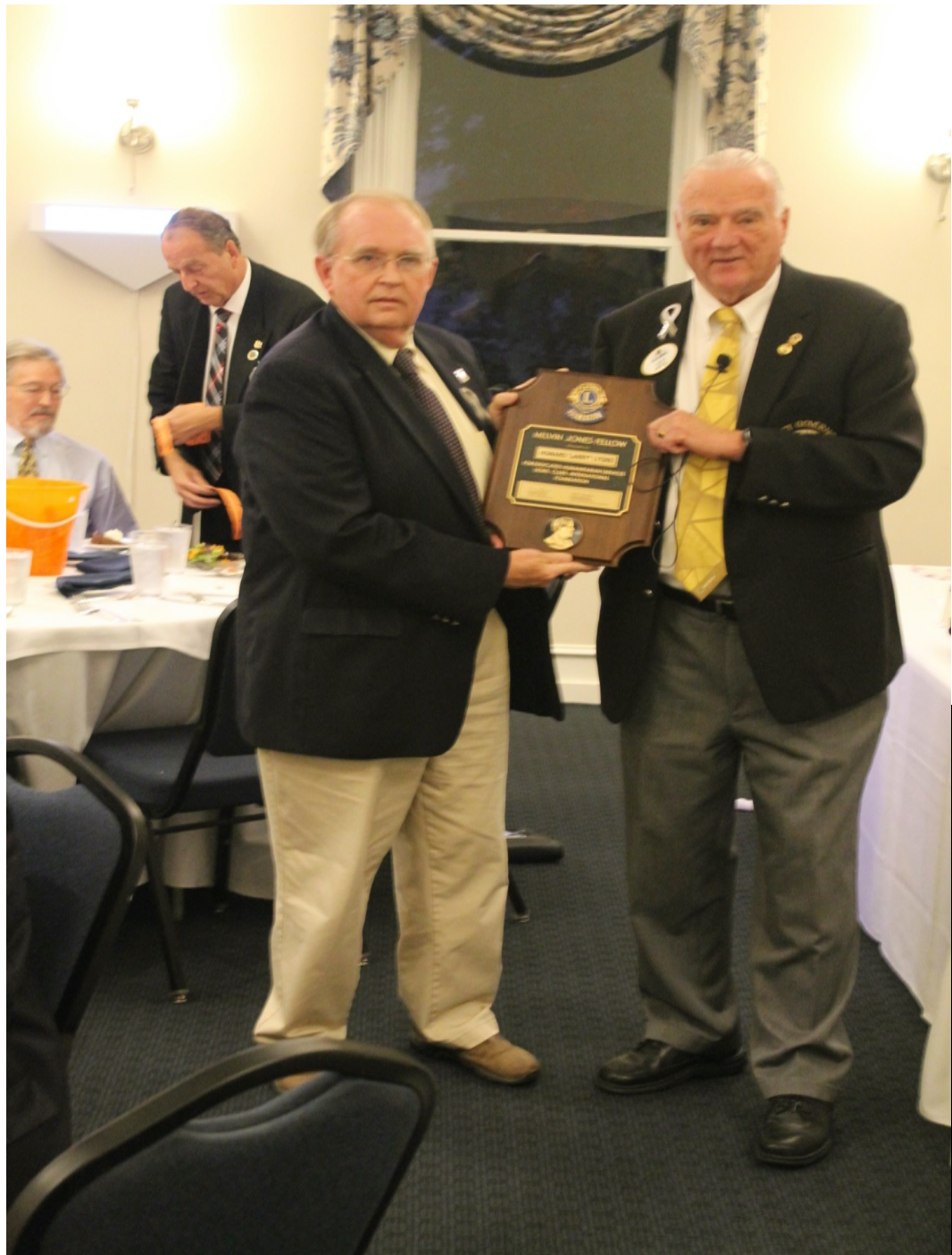

As Pediatric Cancer Chairman for 22-B, I am sending the following information to all of the Clubs in our District. Some of you may be aware of the need for Franklin Kirwan and his family. Frank is six years old and a first grader at Northwestern Elem. School in Mardela. He has recently been diagnosed with multiple brain tumors, as well as tumors on his stomach and his side. One of the brain tumors is located on his optic nerve, which means he will lose his vision.

Frank is scheduled to start chemotherapy once a week for a year at Johns Hopkins Hospital, where he will have to stay at least one night following his treatment.

His mother Mandy is a single mom with two other children in addition to Frank. She works as a Dental Asst. Her employer is allowing her to keep her job during this emotional time, as she needs the insurance to help pay Frank's medical bills. Mandy is trying very hard to keep up with her bills. However, she needs help with gas to travel back and forth to Johns Hopkins, as well as toll fees, parking fees, hotel stays and numerous other medical bills.

As Pediatric Cancer chair, I am asking for donations of gift cards, cash or checks (made payable to Mandy Kirwan) to help out this family in need. Any amount will be greatly appreciated.

A highpoint of the program was the Fireside Chat with former Senator Barbara Mikulski. Senator Mikulski lavished praised on the efforts of the MD22 Lions and the cooperative relationship between Wilmer and the Lions. She reminisced on her friendship with the esteemed Dr. Patz and provided a little history on his role in bringing Lions and Wilmer together. (Dr. Patz's family was also in attendance).

In keeping with the theme of the program, "Summit for Sight" PDG John Shwed donned his mountain-climbing gear to present an overview of the LVRF. 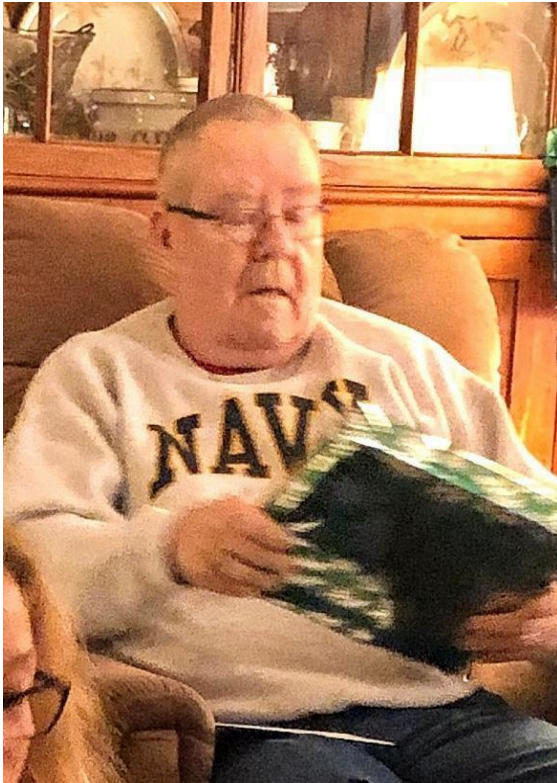
