

Support our service

Hello District, 1-A Lions, Greetings from the VOICES team, the Charitable Arm of District 1-A.

The VOICES team continued to be busy during the month of October.

We continue to receive many hearings aid request for the open areas in District 1-A. In October we received 3 requests bringing our total to \$12,986.00 for 3 months (16-month total \$20,486.00).

The "Can you Hear Me Now?" fundraiser was launched in mid-September. Our goal is to raise

\$7,500. Currently, we have reached 27% of our goal. Emails have been sent to all the clubs (Presidents & Secretaries) asking for a donation so that we can continue to provide hearing aids for those in need. I have also been attending Region meetings to talk about this have campaign and received favorable responses. Please note that when we receive requests for open areas, we do reach out to the clubs closest to the area donations. We also receive donations throughout the year from Lions and Lions Clubs within District 1-A

VOICES will be sponsoring a Christmas at Brookfield Zoo on Sunday November 9th. The tree will be decorated with crafty handmade ornaments made by Lion Director Cindy Meyer. We will have a table to provide information about VOICES to the public.

When we receive a request for eyeglasses in the open areas, we initially reach out to the closest club. Recently we received another request near the Worth Lions Club area, who are currently working with the client to provide glasses. Again, another club has stepped up to help those in need.

Children Vision testing, we had a busy October for vision screenings. We screened 86 children in October.

Raffle tickets for the Presidents Raffle will go on sale in November for \$20 a ticket (Only 300 tickets will be sold). The drawing will be held daily on Facebook live at 12 Noon. The drawing will begin on Thursday February 12th and end on Sunday February 22nd. There will be 1 winning ticket drawn per day for \$200.00 and the ticket will be put back in the drum for future drawings. On February 12th and 22nd there will be 2 winning tickets pulled for \$200.00 each. VOICES members will have tickets available for sale soon.

While we've made significant gains in awareness and training, our year-end membership data reveals key challenges—particularly around retention and club vitality.

1. Do a member satisfaction check.

Before going out to recruit, look inside. How's your club doing? Are your members happy? Do you have a positive club culture? Happy members who enjoy being a Lion are more likely to successfully recruit friends, family and others to your club.

2. Connect your club membership and marketing chairpersons.

Does your club have a membership chairperson? How about a marketing chairperson? If not, you'll want to fill these roles because marketing and membership growth go hand in hand. If you already have these

chairpersons in place, make sure they're working together to promote your club and recruit new members.

3. Get social.

Social media is one of the most powerful tools you have for recruiting members. The more you promote your club's incredible work, the more visible you'll be and the more opportunities you'll have to connect with people looking to serve. So, use social media to invite people to join your club for a service project or attend one of your events, and be sure everyone in your club is sharing, tagging and reposting stories about your club. 4. Don't forget traditional media.

Social media isn't the only way to get your club noticed. Local newspapers, magazines and newsletters are also great ways to promote your club. Make connections with your local media and other organizations and community groups to discover opportunities to get the word out.

5. Apply for the Lions International Marketing Award.

Marketing is critical for recruitment, but it's also a fun way to collaborate with your club and be creative. So why not embrace a little friendly competition by taking your shot at global recognition and great prizes? Your club can apply for the Lions International Marketing Award by creating a marketing campaign focused on member recruitment. Gather your team, plan your marketing campaign, and go out and get some new members.

6. Recruit while you serve.

One of the best ways to recruit is by doing what you do best — serving. So

invite people to serve you and see what it's like to be a Lion. Wear Lionsbranded clothing to your service projects for visibility and bring promotional materials to hand out to people you meet while out in the community.

7. Host a member recruitment event.

Service is our focus, but bonding and having a good time is also a big part of the Lion experience — so don't be afraid to show off that side to potential members! Consider hosting a member recruitment event that's more of a social gathering. It could be a happy hour, picnic, ice cream social, game night or whatever works for your club. Promote the event on social media and encourage everyone in your club to invite at least five people.

8. Write and share your Lion stories.

Every Lion has a story to tell about their member experience. But is every Lion in your club ready to share theirs? Consider a club activity where everyone writes their story. It doesn't have to be long — it can be as simple as jotting down why you joined or why you love being a Lion. Once your stories are ready, find creative ways to share them on social media or your club's website. Or, simply use them while talking with prospective members.

9. Make connections in your community.

It's not always what you know, but who you know. Consider ways you can expand your network, like meeting local business owners or getting involved in community events. Participate in a golf outing, volunteer at a hospital or school, or even attend another group's pancake breakfast. The more you're out and about, the more people you'll meet — so think of creative ways to make new connections. These connections just may become new partners, supporters or even new members.

10. Just Ask!

There are lots of different ways to find new members. But at the end of the day, one of the easiest and most effective ways to recruit is to simply ask people to join. Imagine if every Lion brought one new member to your club—think of how many more people you could serve. All it takes is asking one family member, friend or neighbor.







Oak Lawn – Hometown School District Feed 6 Community Event Saturday, December 13, 2025

This is an international award winning program coordinating a day-long event with 200 volunteers packaging 30,000 meal equivalents (350,000 over 9 years) of pasta product which will be distributed to 28 local food agencies (pantries and other) and further promote our broader Family + Community Resource Network delivering a complete array of vital services and supports to hundreds of families in the greater Oak Lawn area.

- This year's Feed 6 Mega event on December 13th is targeted to exceed completion of 350,000 meal equivalents (over a 9-year period) of an enhanced macaroni and cheese product.
- This entails a day-long community packaging event at the Oak Lawn Hometown Middle School including 200+ volunteers working in two-hour shifts.
- This year's goal of 30,000 meals (2-and-a-half tons of packaged product) will be packaged and delivered to approximately 28 organizations including food pantries, churches, schools, veteran's groups, homeless shelters and a variety of service organizations. (see attached list)
- These organizations support thousands of food challenged families well beyond the Oak Lawn area. 90% of the completed food is distributed within one week following the event, before Christmas and at a time when food pantries are severely depleted.
- Because many of the food agencies also provide other community services including emergency support, clothing, utility bill assistance, senior support, homelessness prevention, temporary housing and many other services, Feed 6 plays a critical strategic role in our Family + Community Resource Network (FCRN) aiding ALL families in our community, not just D123 families.
- The D123 Feed 6 program has garnered International award recognition for the school district.

We have 8 additional requests under review. Each pair of hearing aids average cost is \$718. We work with your foundation (Lions of Illinois) to purchase the hearing aids and also with UIC (University of Chicago/LIERI (Lions Illinois Eye Research Institute) for when additional testing is needed.

All applicants are vetted to make sure they qualify for hearing aid assistance.

The requests have significantly increased due to government funding being cut, which causes people to look at other avenues for help.


