LCIF REPORT ON 3/21/2026

We have made headway toward reaching our goal of \$60,834. I am proud to report due to your effort we are currently at 45% of our goal raising \$27,326 in donation to **LCIF**. Per member Average Donation \$15.22. Based on last week's count there were 1,770 members from our 69 clubs in District 1A. If we calculate how much each member should contribute to meet our goal for the year, each member needs to donate \$34.37, which is achievable if we all put our hearts into sharing our blessings to those in need.

We are on a \$33,508 gap to our fund-raising goal.

The 2025-2026 Lion year closes 6/30/2026. There is still time to donate for this year.

RESOLUTION

TO AMEND THE LIONS OF ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS CONSTITUTION – ARTICLE XII, STATE REVENUE, Section 1

Subject: *This proposed amendment would place a \$500 limit on expense reimbursement for each out-going District Governor attending the International Convention at, or near, the end of their term. It would also add the out-going Council Chairperson and out-going International Convention Chairperson with the same \$500 expense reimbursement.*

WHEREAS, very few Multiple Districts within the USA and Canada provide any reimbursement to its out-going District Governors attending the International Convention at, or near, the end of their term; and,

WHEREAS, the current language in the MD-1 Constitution describing the International Convention Fund is vague in what expenses are reimbursable; and,

WHEREAS, MD-1 does not currently have any protocols on how much reimbursement can be given out-going District Governors for their attendance at the International Convention; and,

WHEREAS, because of the lack of reimbursement protocols, MD-1 in recent years, has been over-spending in the International Convention Fund; and,

WHEREAS, this amendment would result in an improved fiscal responsibility MD-1 would have to the Lions of Illinois in managing reimbursement of the out-going District Governors attending the International Convention,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT Section 1, paragraph 3 of Article XII of the MD-1 Constitution, regarding the International Convention Fund, be adopted as shown below, effective at the close of the 2026 State Convention.

MD-1 Constitution, ARTICLE XII, STATE REVENUE, Section 1.

One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) per capita of said fund shall be **allocated toward the available for use for this State's participation in the International Convention.** Expenses of each out-going District Governor, **out-going Council Chairperson and the out-going International Convention Chairperson in connection with his/her** attending the International Convention at or near the conclusion of his/her term of office shall be considered a proper charge against this International Convention Fund. Reimbursement **out of this fund** for said expenses of such outgoing District Governors, **out-going Council Chairperson and out-going International Convention Chairperson out of this fund attending the International Convention** shall be made upon receipt by the state secretary treasurer of an MD-1 Expense Claim form and receipts for said covered expenses, with a maximum limit of \$500 per each outgoing District Governor, the out-going Council Chairperson and the out-going International Convention Chairperson attending the International Convention. ~~according to the General Rules of Reimbursement as adopted by the Council of Governors each year.~~ In addition, expenses incurred by the State's participation in the International Convention for the parade, hospitality room food and rental, and Plenary Session, previously approved by the Council of Governors, shall also be considered proper charges against this International Convention Fund, provided that all aforementioned expenses do not surpass the annual per capita tax of the International Convention Fund.

**RESOLUTION TO ADOPT PROPOSED AMENDMENT
TO THE MD-1 CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS**

Subject: This proposed amendment would allow the newly elected District Governors to hold their first meeting either at the site of the International Convention or at a site in MD-1, either which should be held within thirty (30) days after the conclusion of the International Convention.

Whereas, it is becoming more and more costly and difficult to secure a location at the International Convention to hold this meeting and,

Whereas, many incoming District Governors do not or can not travel to an out of country International Convention and,

Whereas, a meeting held in MD-1 after the International Convention would give all newly elected District Governors the opportunity to attend and represent their sub-districts respectively and,

Whereas, this proposed amendment would possibly save the Multiple District money for not having to pay for a location at the International Convention, could allow all District Governors to attend and could be held in person or via electronically,

Now, therefore, be it resolved that Article VII, section 8, of the MD-1 Constitution, regarding first meeting of the newly elected District Governors, be amended as follows, and take effect at the conclusion of the 2026 Multiple District Convention.

Article VII, section 8: ~~At the meeting to be held during the International Convention following their election, the newly elected District Governors in attendance shall fix a time and place for the next meeting of the State Council, which meeting shall be held not more than sixty (60) days following the adjournment of that Convention.~~ Following their election at the International Convention, the newly elected District Governors shall call their first meeting no less than thirty (30) days after the adjournment of that Convention. This meeting may be held at the site of the Convention, at a site in MD-1 and may held electronically or in person. Subsequent meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be fixed by the action of the Council. Special meetings may be called either by the Chairperson, as deemed necessary and advisable, or by the individual requests of any three members of the Council made either to the Council chairperson or the State Secretary-Treasurer. Upon receipt of the third such request, the Council chairperson or

State Secretary-Treasurer shall, without delay, give written notification (postal or electronic) to all members of the Council of the time and place such special meeting, stating the purpose for which it is being called, with said notice given at least fourteen (14) days prior to such special meeting. The Council Parliamentarian and State Secretary-Treasurer shall also be given said notice.

Whereas, to clarify when said statements and reports shall be printed in the Lions of Illinois Magazine,

Now, therefore, be it resolved that Article XII, Section 7, be amended as follows and such changes to take effect at the conclusion of the 2026 Multiple District Convention.

Constitution, Article XII, Section 7, to be amended as follows:

"The annual financial statements and the annual auditor's report thereon shall be published in the Lions of Illinois Magazine in the issue following the date on which the annual auditor's report is received **adopted by the current council of governors**".

Resolution

TO AMEND THE LIONS OF ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS

CONSTITUTION-ARTICLE XII, STATE REVENUE, Section 1

Subject: *The proposed amendment would eliminate the State Magazine Fund and transfer the One Dollar (\$1.00) annual per capita of said Fund that is currently collected for the Magazine Fund, to the State Administrative Fund, making the annual per capita amount to the State Administrative Fund at Eight Dollars (\$8.00).*

WHEREAS, the state magazine for several years has ONLY been published and posted on line, with no printed copies being issued; and,

WHEREAS, the editor's salary is paid from the general fund; and

WHEREAS, the magazine is posted on the state website, an expense covered by the general fund and it is also sent out via email to club presidents and secretaries who have email addresses on file with the editor; and,

WHEREAS, the State Administrative Fund would now receive Eight Dollars (\$8.00) annually without incurring a dues increase,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, Sections 1,2 and 3 of Article XII of the MD-1 Constitution be amended as follows, effective at the close of the 2026 State Convention.

MD-1 Constitution, ARTICLE XII, STATE REVENUE, Section 1

Beginning with the fiscal year commencing on July 1, an annual per capita State Administrative, International Convention, Promotional Fund and Magazine Fund Tax of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be levied upon each member of each of Club in the State and shall be paid in advance by each Club in two (2) semi-annual payments as follows:...

~~Seven Dollars (\$7.00)~~ Eight Dollars (\$8.00) per capita of said fund shall be used exclusively for defraying State Administrative Fund expenses, which includes State Administrative Fund expenses, which includes State Convention Administrative expenses.

~~One Dollar (\$1.00) per capita of said Fund shall be used exclusively to design, edit and post a magazine to the state's website monthly. Two (2) or more issues of the magazine may be combined should the need arise, at the sole discretion of the Council.~~

Section 2

In the event there is a balance remaining at the end of the fiscal year in the State Administrative, International Convention, ~~or Magazine Funds~~ after payment of all State Administrative ~~and International Convention and Magazine expenses~~, any portion of the remaining balance of each said Fund may be reallocated by the next succeeding State Council to other Funds to assist with meeting budgetary needs. Notwithstanding, funds in the Promotional Fund shall be used exclusively as outlined in Section 1 of this Article.

Section 3

The State Council shall not incur expenses in excess of cash on hand together with anticipated income from the respective annual per capita State Administrative, International Convention ~~and Promotional Fund and Magazine Fund~~ tax based on semi-annual billings. No council shall, at any time, make a single purchase, nor commit to incur any pledge or indebtedness in excess of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), without first obtaining an affirmative vote of the Lions of Illinois at its State Convention.

Constitution & By-Laws Report

PCC Eric Fenton

The Constitution & By-Laws Committee has 5 resolutions to present at the State Convention this May in Bloomington. There are 2 other resolutions that, if the proper approvals are made at the February Council of Governor's meeting, will be added to the others for presentation.

All of the resolutions will be printed in the state magazine prior to the State Convention.

Each District should receive copies so they can be presented to the District for discussion at Conventions or caucuses.

A quick review of what will be on the ballot is:

Resolution to eliminate the Magazine tax of \$1.00 as the magazine is electronic now and add the \$1.00 back into the State Administrative and Convention Fund.

Resolution to reduce the amount of State reimbursement for District Governors traveling to the International Convention at the end of their year as Governor.

Resolution to add the State Global Extension Chairperson position to the Constitution with a full description of duties and responsibilities.

Resolution to allow the incoming Governors to have their first Council Meeting at either the site of the International Convention where they are sworn in or at a site in MD-1 within 30 days of the end of the International Convention. If the meeting is in MD-1, it may be an in person or electronic (i.e. Zoom or other means) meeting.

Resolution to clarify when the official audit of the Council is to be printed in the State Magazine for the Lions of Illinois.

The above resolutions were approved by the Council of Governors and will be on the ballot at the State Convention in May.

Two additional resolutions may be added depending on action of the Council with regard to updates for the MD-1 Policy Manual. If the updates are approved, they will be as follows:

A resolution will be presented that specifies and defines what allocations are made from the State Administrative Fund.

A resolution will be presented to define the allocation of funds for an International Officer Candidate (International Director or 3rd Vice President) from the Promotion Fund.

Any State Constitution & By-Laws Committee member should be able to address any questions that may arise in their Districts.

All resolutions should also be presented to all of the delegates attending the State Convention during one of the plenary sessions.
