Dear Lions of 4-L4,



11th Annual Seal Beach Lions Club Charity Golf Tournament 4 Man Scramble




This years event will be held Thursday, May 1, 2008 at the well-manicured Navy Golf Course, Cypress, California.


Registration begins at 10:30 am, with tee-off at 1:00 pm.

SEAL BEACH LIONS OFFER FREE RIDES ON ST. PATRICK'S DAY

If you are young and want to celebrate St. Patrick's day drinking green beer, Seal Beach is the place to be. This cozy beach community houses 4 Irish pubs on the one block of Main Street.

Unfortunately, young people, drinking and driving are not a good combination.

Fortunately, the Seal Beach Police Department recognized that something had to be done to keep revelers from getting behind the wheel after celebrating. Five years ago they enlisted the help of Straub Distributing and the Seal Beach Lions Club.

It has been nothing short of a win-win combination. Straub generously pays for the rental of a number of passenger vans as well as the cost of posters put up in all the establishments on Main Street. They also pay the Seal Beach Lions a "token" for each person driven home.

The Lions set up a booth on Main Street and wait for those in need of a ride. Whether the police "handdeliver" a customer or they walk up themselves, they are driven home. Passengers are usually so appreciative of the service given, they offer tips to the drivers. Being handed a cool \$20 is not unusual.

While this has proven to be a great fundraiser for the Seal Beach Lions Club, raising anywhere from \$3000-\$5000 depending on what day of the week St. Pat's Day falls, it has also served a much more important service.

Drinking and driving is the major cause of death in young adults. If they have saved even a single life by keeping a drunk driver off the road, each of the Lions working this project will tell you that sitting out in the cold, passing up on the green beer and putting up with some pretty drunk people is all worth it.





HEARING & SPEECH ACTION NEWS

We haven't talked about newborn hearing screening for a while, so here is an update on the situation.

Hearing loss is the most common birth defect – a little know fact, but one of enormous consequence to those who are affected. In the year 2000 the Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Authorization Legislation (EHDI) was enacted. This speeded up the formation at the State level of screening programs providing hearing screening of newborns and follow-up care for the one in three newborns who fail their test. Today, 40 states offer this service, and 95 percent of all newborns have their hearing tested. The average age for receiving a first diagnosis of hearing loss has declined from 30 years to just three months of age.

Sounds great, BUT, one in three newborns who fail their hearing test is not diagnosed, and may receive no follow-up care. This may result in delayed speech development, which may be hard to overcome later and may, in turn, affect the development of social skills. Among those who are diagnosed, the parents of almost one in four are not made aware of the options for helpful early intervention services. "We need to do better at making the options available to them", says former Surgeon General Dr. C. Everett Koop.

The Early Hearing Detection and Intervention <u>Re</u>authorization bill has been introduced in the House (H.R. 1198) and in the Senate (S. 1069) providing authority to concentrate on those children who are falling through the cracks, providing critical family-to-family support programs and enabling the NHI to establish a post-doctoral research fellowship program to recruit researchers to become involved in early detection and intervention.

Lions can help by contacting their Congressmen and asking them to co-sponsor these bills.

WHEN EAGLES DON'T FLY

THE STORY OF FREEDOM & JEFF

When Freedom came in she could not stand. Both wings were broken,?her left wing in 4 places. She was emaciated and covered in lice. We made the decision to give her a chance at life, so I took her to the vet's office.

From then on, I was always around her. We had her in a huge dog carrier with the top off, and it was loaded up with shredded newspaper for her to lay in. I used to sit and talk to her, urging her to live, to fight; and she would lay there looking at me with those big brown eyes.

We also had to tube feed her for weeks. This went on for 4-6 weeks, and by then she still couldn't stand. It got to the point where the decision was made to euthanize her if she couldn't stand in a week.

You know you don't want to cross that line between torture and rehab, and it looked like death was winning. She was going to be put down that Friday, and I was supposed to come in on that Thursday afternoon. I didn't want to go to the center that Thursday, because I couldn't bear the thought of her being euthanized; but I went anyway, and when I walked in everyone was grinning from ear to ear. I went immediately back to her cage; and there she was, standing on her own, a big beautiful eagle. She was ready to live. I was just about in tears by then That was a very good day.

We knew she could never fly, so the director asked me to glove train her. I got her used to the glove, and then to jesses, and we started doing education programs for schools in western Washington. We wound up in the newspapers, radio (believe it or not) and some TV. Miracle Pets even did a show about us.

In the spring of 2000, I was diagnosed with non-hodgkins lymphoma. I had stage 3, which is not good (one major organ plus everywhere), so I wound up doing 8 months of chemo. Lost the hair - the whole bit. I missed a lot of work. When I felt good enough, I would go to Sarvey Wildlife Center, and take Freedom out for walks. Freedom would also come to me in my dreams and help me fight the cancer. This happened time and time again.

Fast forward to November 2000, the day after Thanksgiving, I went in for my last checkup. I was told that if the cancer was not all gone after 8 rounds of chemo, then my last option was a stem cell transplant. Anyway, they did the tests; and I had to come back Monday for the results. I went in Monday, and I was told that all the cancer was gone. Yahoo!

So the first thing I did was get up to Sarvey Center and take the big girl out for a walk. It was misty and cold. I went to her flight and jessed her up, and we went out front to the top of the hill. I hadn't said a word to Freedom, but somehow she knew. She looked at me and wrapped both her wings around me to where I could feel them pressing in on my back (I was engulfed in eagle wings), and she touched my nose with her beak and stared into my eyes, and we just stood there like that for I don't know how



long. That was a magical moment. We have been soul mates ever since she came in. This is a very special bird.

On a side note: I have had people who were sick come up to us when we are out, and Freedom has some kind of hold on them. I once had a guy who was terminal come up to us and I let him hold her. His knees just about buckled and he swore he could feel her power coarse through his body. I have so many stories like that.

I never forget the honor I have of being so close to such a magnificent spirit as Freedom's.


