# "Roar with Enthusiasm"

Greetings to the Lions, Leos, and friends of District 4-L4,

Last month I issued a challenge to do something to show your love for your fellow man on Valentine's Day or anytime February. How did you do? Did you take my challenge seriously? You can still do it, remember that as Lions, we know that kindness, concern, generosity, and love are not reserved for just one day in the year.

You might be thinking, "oh yeah, what did YOU do Gov?" If you are, good for you! What kind of a leader would I be if I was not willing to do what I ask of you? Sheila and I joined the La Habra Host Lions in preparing a meal for the Ronald McDonald House in Orange County on Valentine's Day. Lion Thom Fleury was the Master Chef and directed all of us in the necessary meal preparations. I learned the proper way to cut pickles and a new way to make potatoes using olive oil. The dinner was delicious.

In addition to getting to help with the meal, Sheila and I toured the Ronald McDonald House. It is really quite remarkable. We were told that the number one diagnosis that brings parents to the Ronald McDonald House is "neonatal". That means babies, babies needing special surgeries, or who are extremely premature for example. Imagine the worries and fears a parent might face when their new baby is fighting for life. The type of babies that are sent to CHOC (Children's Hospital of Orange County) are sent because they require the most specialized care, care that is not provided at most hospitals. Sometimes these babies and children can be in the hospital for months. My wife the NICU nurse tells me that generally speaking, a premature baby will stay in the hospital until the due date. Imagine if your baby was born 16 weeks early. What if you lived far away from CHOC? Would you want to or be able to leave your baby or child who is struggling to survive? Ronald McDonald House is a place for parents to stay so that they can be near their child. Would you believe parents are asked to pay \$ 5 a day? That means that a tremendous amount of support is required to keep this charitable service alive.

There are many ways to show love for your fellow man through service and giving. I encourage you to do what is in your heart. If your club is looking for a way to give to the community, I would recommend you consider how you might support Ronald McDonald House. You should also know that there are Ronald McDonald Houses in several locations in Southern California. 



# HEARING & SPEECH ACTION NEWS

March 1, 2008

Here's a tip that can change your life – and help you help others to do the same. Formerly known as the Government Printing Office, the GSA Federal Citizen Information Center publishes a Quarterly "Consumer Information Catalog". The contents include publications from a great number of Government Departments and Agencies on subjects such as Cars, Computers, Education, Employment, Family, Food, Health, Housing, Money, Small Business, Travel & More. The current Winter 2007-08 edition lists nearly 150 free items, about 50 at \$1.00 and a dozen or so more at \$2 to \$10. The Catalog is available at www.pueblo.gsa.gov.

The jewel I found is Publication 547R, "Sound Advice About Age-Related Hearing Loss", an eight-page reprint from FDA Consumer magazine. With full-color illustrations and un-biased writing it describes the mechanism of hearing, the treatments available for hearing loss, the types of hearing devices and the hearing health care professionals who are involved in dealing with hearing problems. It ends with a list of more sources of information. If you, a family member or friend need help with this most common cause of hearing loss this booklet is an ideal starting point on the road to better hearing.
