
I'm looking forward to meeting with all of you during Governor Judy's visitations and informing you about the great Lions Float in the Rose Parade among other topics.

LIONS SUPPORT CHOC

Orange County Central Lions Club is supporting Children Hospital of Orange County (CHOC) California kids as they are coping with hospitalization with a special donation of \$800 in gift cards to Target and Michaels.

The Child Life Department help kids to effectively cope in the hospital setting and to encourage their continued development. They do this through a variety of programs. They offer activities such as music therapy, playrooms, special entertainment, Radio Lollipop and art therapy. Additionally, they have Child Life Specialists who are available to help the children become more familiar with the hospital setting through medical play, preparation for procedures and surgeries, and normalization of the hospital environment. Child Life Specialists also assist children through procedures by providing support and distraction.



Annie Esquerra, Child Life Specialist of CHOC Hospital indicated that the lion's donation will help them do their job in so many ways. Their 3 playrooms are stocked with toys, board games, crafts, and video game systems which they are able to provide because of such donations. The playrooms are open every day for children to come and just be normal kids. It is a safe zone where kids can interact and have fun and where no invasive procedures or exams are allowed.

Also, they give children prizes to encourage positive coping or to reward them for their hard work. Often times simple activities such as getting up and walking or taking medication is difficult for the hospitalized child. They use prizes as incentives to meet these treatment goals. For example, if a child is having difficulty taking his medication they provide a sticker chart. When the child fills up the sticker chart for taking their medicine (for instance after taking their medication 3 times when asked) he or she gets a prize.

Jack Perich, President of the Orange County Central Lions Club indicated that part of his wish as president, was to help the CHOC Children. The Lions donation of gift cards can be used by the CHOC Staff to purchase the toys and games enjoyed by the families and patients that spend time at CHOC Children's.

This year's topic is very appropriate based on all of the discussions regarding our Health Care and where the government is going with it.

TOPIC IS: "UNIVERSAL HEALTH CARE HOW WILL IT AFFECT US?"

The process will be as follows:

- 1. MD4 will be sending out postcards to the Presidents of each club on September 1, 2009.


My wonderful friends, I was delighted with my warm reception at the recent Cabinet Meeting. I apologize for missing my article in the last two issues of the Forum. I'm sad to say we have lost several terrific Lions and I have quite a lot to report.

Bill Winstead was a kind man with a great man with a great sense of humor. He was born in March of 1916 and passed on in June of 2009 at the age of 93. He became a Garden Grove Lion in 1977 and served as President in 1990-1991. He was awarded Club Lion of the Year in 1993-1994. Bill traveled to the Garden Grove Host Lions Club meetings from Fallbrook every Wednesday. He worked in Real Estate, but prior to that spent 30 years in the US Navy, serving in World War II and the Korean War. He loved golf and helped design the Navy Golf Course in Los Alamitos. He was a highly respected individual and a great Lion.

Bruce Roth was a long time member of the Costa Mesa-Orange Coast Lions Club. He suffered from Diabetes and lost a leg last year. I can't seem to get a lot of information about Lion Bruce, but I'm sure he was a wonderful man and a dedicated Lion. May he rest in peace.

John Selters, long time member of the Pomona Host Lions Club, passed away on Friday Night, May 1, 2009, from natural causes. Johnny was born in Big Timber, Montana, on September 14, 1914. He would have been 96 in September. He was a key member in his club and was recently honored with a Melvin Jones fellowship. For many years he operated a local law firm where his son, Ben Selters, also a member of the Pomona Host Lions Club, continues the tradition of service.

Luther Mitchell was a past president and Life Member of the Buena Park Noon Lions Club. He was raised in Fullerton, and was a graduate of Fullerton College, and the University of Southern California. During his youth, baseball games were squeezed in between hard work, highlighted by games with professional players back in the day when they traveled from town to town playing local teams. Luther and his brother both earned baseball scholarships to USC. During the late 40's and 50's he worked as a dental technician for Dr. Montgomery, known as "the dentist of the stars". Luther had a unique ability to match color shades perfectly, a skill bigger than life for movie stars. In the late 1950's he opened his own dental business in Buena Park. He later served as President of the Southern California Dental Labratory Association. Luther was generous with his time in professional, and community

organizations. He was a life member and past President of the Buena Park Noon Lion's Club, a member of the Masonic Lodge and Al Maliakah Booster's Club. Lion Luther served as Deputy District Governor in 1977-1978. He was awarded one of Lions highest awards, the Melvin Jones Fellowship. On May 7, 2009 he went home to Heaven after a lengthy and valiant fight. He was greatly loved and will be missed.

Dr. Roger Ellison was born in Fort Wayne, Indiana on July 31, 1924. He put himself through medical school and received his MD from Indiana University in 1948. In addition to being a great doctor, he was a great community spirit involved in many local charities, churches, and projects. One of these was the Pomona Host Lions Club which he joined in January of 1955. He passed away peacefully on May 18, 2009.

Gene Adloff and his wife, Louise, have been devoted members of the Buena Park Noon Lions Club

for many years. Lion Gene was born August 20, 1916 in Gonzales Texas. He went through high school there and graduated from the University of Texas with a degree in chemical engineering. He Joined the BP Noon Lions in 1971 and served as club treasurer for 30 years. He passed away on June 9, 2009 after a valiant battle with Cancer. He was a dedicated Lion for 42 years and a wonderful man. He is greatly missed.



After learning about the Lions involvement in the Tournament of Roses Parade, Sheila was inspired to become active with the Lions Float project. She now serves as a Director for Lions Float, Inc. "HEAR US ROAR"

We now have the first District Approved Project of the 2009-2010 Lions Year! At the July 26 District 4-L4 Cabinet meeting a remarkable new project was described by guest speakers Doug Lopez and his brother, members of Whittier Host Lions Club. They have aptly named their project "Hear Us Roar" to label Lions involvement in the huge task of diagnosis and treatment of hearing loss in newborns and children in the formative preschool years and beyond.

The need for our help is evident by the statistics that show 12,000 infants in the United States are born with a hearing impairment. Of these, 4,000 are profoundly deaf. In fact, hearing loss is the number one birth defect in the United States. Most States have mandated Early Hearing Detection and Intervention (EHDI) programs, but most are unfunded and Federal funding has been decreasing every year.

While currently 95% of newborns are screened for hearing loss, that screening has not yet been successfully linked to systems of precise diagnosis, early intervention, medical care and family support. A major problem is the need for education of both caregivers and family members and financial support to assure that appropriate services are rendered.

The plan by which Lions can assist in this situation was presented in a thorough manner by the Lopez brothers and their reception by Lions in attendance was immediate and enthusiastic. A motion was quickly passed to establish a District Approved Project. Further details on how you can participate are forthcoming.

"Wendilts and Tibidows"

With our new year just getting under way, and not much input yet from the individual clubs about any of their successes thus far, I thought I would do a different kind of column this month. This is something that has been on my mind for a long time and I just needed a forum to express it. So, I thought, what better forum than the 4-L Forum? With your indulgence, here goes:

Most people are familiar with the word "Nimby", which is an acronym for "not in my back yard". The word, as you know, reflects an attitude shared by many people. It simply means that although they recognize the need for something, a new jail or a power plant for example, they will not support such a project if it means having it located in their area. "Nimby" has come to be an accepted term due to its usage and familiarity. Imagine this scenario: A new member, maybe even YOUR cub, after hearing an open invitation, decides to attend a club board meeting. At the proper time, he proposes a new fund raiser and states that he is willing to chair the event. Someone then drops a "Wendilt" or a "Tibidow", the cub's idea is ignored and his bubble is burst. Sadly, it is just this kind of attitude that can sour a new member against becoming involved in the club and, worse yet, can lead to his resignation. The bitterest pill of all to swallow is that this individual may have gone on to become a club leader, but the club will never know because he was not given the opportunity to fail.... or to succeed.

Try to think about this scenario when hearing ideas for new projects and fundraising events. Perhaps you may try using another acronym, "Lagias", or "Let's all give it a shot!" Remember, even your club's biggest and best fundraising event was once someone's idea!


