Dear Lions, Leos, and friends of District 4-L4,

It's the New Year 2009 and we have old business to finish and new business to begin.

Lion Tom Brown and I have been arranging the distribution of the \$10,000 emergency grant from LCIF for the victims of the fires in Orange County. We have given \$5,000 to the city of Anaheim for distribution in that area, and \$5,000 to Operation OC, a relief organization based in Tustin , which was the hub of the emergency relief which came into operation immediately following the fires in October. Both amounts of money will be shared out amongst those in need in the form of Target gift certificates, and I hope to be able to make a more detailed report at the Cabinet Meeting on January 24. At that meeting there will be more information from our featured speaker about Operation OC, and the Orange County Rescue Mission.

By the time you read this, the Rose Parade festivities will be over, and I want to give a big thank you to all the Lions in 4L-4 who have contributed to the success of this project in so many ways — Lion Jack Tanaka for taking charge of our district decorating day, Lions John Doogan and Ken Bell for making the Leo decorating day such a success, IPDG Jon Casteel and Lion Sheila Casteel for traveling all over California to make other districts more aware of the project and helping to raise funds, VDG Judy who sold such a lot of float pins, and to all the Lions who went to decorate the float. Our float was so beautiful and such an excellent representation of the work we do as Lions and the wonderful Helen Keller who challenged us, so long ago, to become "Knights of the Blind".

So now we look forward to the next six months. I hope all the clubs made resolutions to get more members, to not drop members and to encourage those wayward Lions to come back and resume their great work for our communities. Remember, I said I wanted to continue the "plus" numbers from last year and to show the rest of California that 4L-4 is always the Mighty Mouse district, not just the Mickey Mouse district.

I shall continue to travel around the district to club meetings and fundraisers and celebrations, and I look forward to seeing all of you again.

FIRE DISASTER 2009

DISASTER RELIEF CHAIRMAN TOM BROWN

Last spring I received several phone calls from our District Governor, Elizabeth Warren, asking me to stay involved in the district. She finally talked me into accepting the Disaster Preparedness Chair. At the time I thought to myself, "Since we had had so many disastrous fires last year, there would not be more this year, after all, hadn't we used up our quota of disasters?" Need I say more?

On that fateful Saturday, November, 15, when I saw smoke to the East, I called the Gov. We must have talked to each other 20 times by Sunday night. I.D. Dana Biggs was already on top of getting the grant from LCIF for us. Sunday, Zone B Chair, Mike Smith and I visited an evacuation center in Anaheim but we were turned away. Basically, we were told "No thanks, we don't need your help". I spoke to many Lions in our district that lived or worked in the burn areas and I was glad to hear that ALL were safe.



Monday morning we had our grant application from LCIF. I made calls to FEMA, and to the cities that were affected by the fires. Some of the people I talked to simply wanted us to give our money to the very same organization that had originally turned away our assistance. Eventually we were put in contact with two groups that we felt comfortable working with: Operation O.C., and The Anaheim Community Foundation. Both of these groups work directly with fire victims.

Governor Elizabeth, V.D.G. Judy Schnitzer, P.D.G.s Barbara Hayward and Mike Scheafer, Ron Hayward, and I met with Operation O.C. and received a tour of their operation. What an organization! We presented them with \$5,000 in Target gift cards to be distributed directly to the fire victims. Later I met with Anaheim Mayor Curt Pringle and Colleen Smagala, Vice President of the Anaheim Community Foundation. I presented them with an additional \$6,100.00 in Target Gift Cards. We have been asked to meet with the Anaheim City Council to be recognized for our great work helping fire victims.



I would like to say a **GREAT BIG Thank You** to all those that stepped up and donated their money to help the fire victims in our district: *LCIF \$10,000.00, Anaheim Lions \$1,100.00, OCKALC Foundation \$1,000.00, HB Host \$500.00, Harbor Mesa \$500.00, D.G. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

The holiday season can be stressful and we generally lose a few members during this time period. However, I am delighted to report that I know of no Lions lost to date. Therefore I get to provide a story about attitude that I enjoyed a lot.

John is the kind of guy you love to hate. He is always in a good mood and always has something positive to say. When asked how he was doing, he would always reply, 'If I were any better, I would be twins!' He was a natural motivator. If an employee was having a bad day, John was there telling the employee how to look on the positive side of the situation. Seeing this style really made me curious, so one day I went up and said to him, 'I don't get it! You can't be a positive person all of the time. How do you do it?'

He replied, 'Each morning I wake up and say to myself, you have two choices today. You can choose to be in a good mood or you can choose to be in a bad mood. I choose to be in a good mood.' Each time something bad happens, I can choose to be a victim or, I can choose to learn from it. I choose to learn from it. Every time someone comes to me complaining, I can choose to accept their complaining or, I can point out the positive side of life. I choose the positive side of life.

'Yeah, right, it's not that easy,' I protested. 'Yes, it is,' he said. 'Life is all about choices. When you cut away all the junk, every situation is a choice. You choose how you react to situations. You choose how people affect your mood. You choose to be in a good mood or bad mood. The bottom line: It's your choice how you live your life.' I reflected on what he said and soon thereafter, I left that job to start my own business. We lost touch, but I often thought about him when I made a choice about life instead of reacting to it.

Several years later, I heard that he was involved in a serious accident, falling some 60 feet from a communications tower. After 18 hours of surgery and weeks of intensive care, he was released from the hospital with rods placed in his back.

I saw him about six months after the accident. When I asked him how he was, he replied, 'If I were any better, I'd be twins. Wanna see my scars?' I declined to see his wounds, but I did ask him what had gone through his mind as the accident took place.

'The first thing that went through my mind was the well-being of my soon-to-be born daughter,' he replied. 'Then, as I lay on the ground, I remembered that I had two choices: I could choose to live or, I could choose to die. I chose to live.'

'Weren't you scared? Did you lose consciousness?' I asked. He continued, 'the paramedics were great. They kept telling me I was going to be fine but when they wheeled me into the ER and I saw the expressions on the faces of the doctors and nurses, I got really scared. In their eyes, I read 'he's a dead man'. I knew I needed to take action.'

We cannot have the student speakers contest without students. Contact and follow up with guidance councilors and speech coaches. Give them a handbook and a contest date. So, #1=GET SPEAKERS.

I've seen excellent speakers bumped from the contest by poor judging. So, #2=GET JUDGES. Get knowledgeable judges. Toastmasters is an excellent source. That's what they do. There's no such thing as a perfect judge. We're people. But grabbing your neighbor at the last minute to be a contest judge is a disservice the the contestants and could be injurious to the contest as a whole. Disaster can be avoided with qualified knowledgeable judges. Maybe getting judges should be #1.

So, amateur speakers, professional judges, organized contest chairmen, comfortable venue = good contest.

A first time contest chairman can run a very professional contest by knowing the handbook and not deviating from the instructions. Creativity is the prerogative of the student speakers, not the contest chairman.

Most of us know about "Captioning", the words that appear on TV and movie screens that are set up to assist in understanding the words that accompany the pictures. And maybe you have seen the CapTel phones with a small screen on the phone that displays the caller's words. Now along comes CapTel's next generation.

WebCapTel connects any phone - your desk phone, cordless phone or cell phone - to your desktop or laptop computer and the Internet. This system displays captions of everything heard on the phone and displays it through your internet browser. Each step in placing or receiving a call is shown on the screen. Your conversation can be saved or printed just like email and you have your computer's abilities to select the type font, size and color you prefer.

Many of these advantages are available with a simpler system called CapTelUSB that connects a special phone to your computer but not the internet. For details call 888-269-7477 (Voice) or 800-482-2424 (TTY) or see www.captionedtelephone.com. Then tell a friend!

Today the News is quick to tell us about the things wrong with our youth. You as molders of the next generation and our future know how narrow a view this really is. The Lions agree.

Your local District 4-L4 Teen Recognition Program (TRP) was first started as a Saddleback Region project in 1989. District Governor Kevin Evans in 1992 introduced the program to the District, to widen the scope.

The purpose of the program is to recognize, support and reward teens for their efforts in volunteerism in promoting a drug, alcohol and tobacco free life-style

Applications are distributed by Lions clubs to local middle schools, high schools and community youth groups. Students aged 13 to 19 years old who have maintained a 2.5 GPA or above and have worked toward helping their peers attend a substance free lifestyle are eligible to receive applications. Applications are evaluated by the Lion's Teen Recognition Committee.

Students honored by TRP are active in both their schools and communities. They spend their free time volunteering in programs such as safe rides, PAL (Peer Assistance Leadership), Red Ribbon Week, D.A.N.C.E. (Drug Alternative Night and Counseling Event). Through the support of our Lions clubs, TRP annually acknowledges these students with plaques and cash honorariums at a special dinner in their honor.

The Teen Recognition Program's success depends on participation in the identification and selection of qualified young people. Lions clubs must ensure all schools, educators-and youth group leaders select and propose suitable candidates. Finally, the committee must make the final selection. If all activities are carried out in a timely manner the deserving Teens will be honored at the Saturday, January 31st, 2009 recognition dinner

THE GIFT OF GIVING

American Family Housing (AFH) and Haven Project (HP) are projects to assist people in need of a fresh start. Over the years **Past District Governor Lion Ellen Liebherr** has cooked a Holiday Meal for the Clients. **The Seal Beach Host Club** participates by subsidizing the cost of food and assisting **Lion Ellen** with the evening.

American Family Housing helps over 1070 clients each day. Huntington Beach Host Lion Bob Murphy is the General Manager and Lion Joyce Murphy also works at the facility.

Lacresha Palmer and Ronald Clough with their four children are clients at the facility. They have been in the AFH Project since August.

The stay consists of one year. It provides them with a house to live in. Lacresha explained to me that they must stay alcohol and drug free. Both of them must be looking for or have jobs. They must attend two classes each week. They have a 10 pm curfew and are also provided with counseling, classes on self esteem, help with resumes and child care assistance. If the AFH has food or supplies they are given that for free. They do pay a portion for the home and utilities. Any extra money they earn after their bills are paid they must save 70%. The project is teaching them how to become self sufficient.

The Haven Project was started in November 2008. It is HUD funded and is a transitional homeless program that has 70% set aside for chronically homeless individuals. Chronically homeless has a legal definition, but is primarily those that have been on the streets for a longer period of time, or are repeatedly homeless. They are the ones that have harder to solve issues such as alcohol and drug addictions, along with mental or behavioral problems.


Michael Zimmerman has been homeless for many, many years. He has been in the project for two weeks. Four people share a two bedroom house. They attend meetings and also have a 10 pm curfew. Michael says since he's been in the project it is teaching











Beside housing this is a program that is heavily service weighted having collaboratives with addiction programs, medical programs, legal, mental health and all sorts of counseling.

You never realize how fortunate you are until you see the other side. One client Timothy McDonald had a job working in the air conditioning field. He lost his job a while back and never learned to save because of alcohol and drug problems. Now he attends AA and NA classes and sees his life turning around. He knows he must take responsibility for himself.

They all appreciated being given this wonderful dinner and party. They expressed their gratitude by saying Thanks. They asked me what are **Lions**, why are you here? You could see in their eyes and hear it in their voices they were touched that we had reached out to provide them with an enjoyable evening. 


ORANGE COUNTY RESCUE MISSION

The Orange County Rescue Mission offers a way out for the homeless and the hurting. It provides training, education, guidance, food, shelter, and health care for homeless men, women, and children for up to two years.

The Village of Hope is a transitional living facility on five acres of the former Tustin Marine Corps Air Base. The base has been transformed into beautifully designed residential suites with a fully licensed medical and dental clinic, child development center, state of the art dining facility funded by the Cheesecake Factory, chapel/auditorium, and vocational/counseling classrooms. The facility provides safe housing and the adult education provided gives residents the tools and resources to become self-sufficient, both in parenting and in new careers. At the same time, kids have day care while their parents learn those new skills.

As well as the Village of Hope, the Rescue Mission also has three other core facilities. Homeless, battered women and children are provided with a safe haven at the House of Hope in the City of Orange. The Mustard Seed Ranch in northern San Diego gives victimized children from foster and group homes a chance be with animals and restore their trust and instill self esteem, and adult male clients can be trained to serve as ranch hands to keep the working ranch running effectively. Hope Family Housing provides a supportive housing program for larger families to help them prepare for the final transition of moving out completely into a home of their own.

The Orange County Rescue Mission is an amazing place, which needs donations of money, food and time. One of the most personal ways to do this, is to adopt a Family Room or a Family Suite at the Village of Hope.


