



Hearing & Speech Action News

"ADA, TRS, FHA, VAEH, IDEA, RA, ABA"

How's that for a mouthful of acronyms? I found these and more when I began looking for answers to a question that was put to me, "What does the Americans with Disabilities Act do for the deaf and hearing impaired?" You too can get yourself educated with two free booklets (available from the Government Services Administration at www.pueblo.gsa.gov)

- 1. The Americans with Disabilities Act Questions and Answers
- 2. A Guide to Disability Rights Laws.

As Lions with a mission to aid the hearing impaired we will do well to learn some of the Answers, and I will provide a few examples here:

- Q. Who is protected from employment discrimination?
- A. "Qualified individuals with disabilities this includes applicants for employment and employees."
- Q. Who is a qualified individual?
- A. "A person who meets legitimate skill, experience, education, or other requirements of an employment position and can perform the essential functions of the position with or without reasonable accommodation."
- Q. What is reasonable accommodation?
- A. "Any modification or adjustment to a job or the work environment that will enable a qualified applicant with a disability to perform essential job functions."

You can see where this is going, so let's move on to Disability Rights Laws.

ADA Title IV – Addresses telephone and television access for people with hearing and speech disabilities. Requires phone companies to establish relay services and enables callers to communicate with each other through a third party communications assistant.

Fair Housing Act – Prohibits housing discrimination on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, familial status and national origin.

Voting Accessibility and Voter Registration Acts - Requires polling places to be physically accessible to people with disabilities and requires that assistance with completion of voter registration forms and transmission of completed forms be available.

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act – (IDEA) requires public school systems to develop appropriate Individualized Education Programs to meet the individualized needs of each student.

My point here is to illustrate the complexity of the system we use to protect the rights of the disabled as well as the challenges faced by organizations like the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), the Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA) and others in assuring the passage and enforcement of the these Acts.



With him was Past International Director Bill lannacone. We were discussing membership growth in our respective Districts. PCC John stressed that, like all successful endeavors, you need a plan. If you are having these problems in your club, maybe it's time to ask for help. The District has M(embership), E(xtension), R(etention), L(eadership), O(rientation) committees to assist you. Give them a call. They are there to help you get going. They won't do it for you, but they will help. We are here to help you grow. Together, we can do it.
