

#3 - Leo Parents- does your club sponsor a Leo Club? Do so and get their parents involved in your club. #4 - Former Leos- they are already trained in service. Even if you don't have a Leo Club in town, you may have former Leos. Find them, induct them, use their hearts, hands and ideas.

The old tried and true ways of gaining new members by asking neighbors, church members and fellow Elks, etc. are still valid and useful methods.

Try them all. A club brochure and a personal "hit list" shouldn't be overlooked for recruiting.

Lion Scott Newton's membership ideas, club leadership and Leo motivation, among his many talents, have gained him recognition by the Seal Beach Host Lions Club as "Lion of the Decade". This at the Dec 1, 2010 meeting. A select few Lions achieve Lion of the Year and some more than once (Governor Norm MacKenzie is a three time winner), but Lion of the Decade is extremely rare, along the lines of being named an Ambassador of Good Will by Lions International. 

Hearing & Speech Action News

WHO, ME?? ---At a recent AARP Convention, an exhibit booth manned by the Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA) was visited by hundreds of people seeking information about hearing loss. By far, the majority were family members who expressed frustration because their husbands, wives, mothers or fathers were refusing to admit they may have some trouble hearing. They spoke of their frustration with TVs blaring, phones unanswered, having to repeat conversations, etc. "How do I get a relative to do something about their hearing loss? They refuse to admit they have a problem and it's driving me crazy!"

One of the most common reactions of people to the onset of hearing loss is <u>denial</u>. A key reason is that in our society hearing loss is seen to be a sign of getting old and confused. This historical baggage ranges from stereotypical usage such as "deaf and dumb" to putting deaf people in institutions for being uneducable. Not to mention the media making fun of the mistakes people make not hearing what is said. These negative associations have resulted in a stigma that has proven hard to eradicate.

However, there is also a positive generational component. Today younger adults are more likely to admit their hearing loss, seek help and move on. They tend to be more comfortable with technology, have grown up with disability rights such as the Americans with Disabilities Act and have never known TV without captioning.

People of any age can turn to HLAA to let their hair down, learn self-advocacy and take advantage of life-changing technology and communication strategies. By taking action to manage their hearing loss they in no way can be seen as old and confused – they are in the game.
