#### When is Lions Hearing Days?

Lions International apparently does not establish a day, week or month devoted to Hearing Health, other than Helen Keller Day on June 1. District 4-L4 celebrates Hearing Days on March 5-6.

On the Club level, Seal Beach Host declared the month of March to be Lions Hearing Days. Launching a campaign to collect hearing aids during the past month, four stories were written for and published by local newspapers. Three included pictures and one was on the cover of the Leisure World SUN. Three new hearing aid recycling locations were selected, Lions HARP brochures were placed at collection sites and hearing aid stickers were added to all 14 eyeglass boxes.

Hearing tests were done using the District Sight & Hearing van at the Seal Beach Health Expo. Hearing aids were donated by Lions members, collected in recycling boxes, donated by members of the community and picked up from people who couldn't make it to a collection site. The total number of hearing aids collected in March was 56! This brings the number of hearing aids donated to the District 4-L4 Hearing Aid Bank to 144 since July 1, 2011.

I'm sure, dear reader, that you realize this kind of success story is pretty rare if not unheard of in District 4-L4.
