

### **International LIONS Club Visitation**

On April 27, my esteemed fellow Lion and mother-in-law Dr. Ana Lorenz and I had an enriching opportunity to visit the Lions Club of San Salvador, El Salvador, Central America. We were received with a very cordial, professional dinner reception and asked to join the president at his table, along with the vice-president, secretary, and treasurer. All in attendance were very welcoming and encouraging for us to share our experiences from our club here in Pomona.

Dr. Milton Salguero, president of the club, is a physician specializing colorectal surgery and is very active in the San Salvador area with various outreach projects. His club has spearheaded ecological projects, as in tree planting very similar to ours, as well as facilitating the construction of a vision-oriented clinic to address the visual deficits (low vision conditions as well as premature retinopathy) of the many citizens in need. Per Dr. Salguero, 37% of the blind that attend the schools of the visually impaired do so because of retinopathy. Dr. Salguero's said that his club has hosted weekend health clinics, catering to both children and adults in need of medical services.



I was given the opportunity to speak to the club about our programs, emphasizing the community service projects we have hosted in the Southern California area

The various fields within my profession of physical rehabilitation allowed for a nice segue into what Lions do best, serving those with visual impairments. I was able to showcase the programs, which Casa Colina offers in our outpatient department, namely the neuro-optometry and low vision clinics. Additionally, I explained how our campus is closely affiliated with the local universities, providing educational opportunities for the many students in the various professional programs, thereby enhancing our community outreach presence throughout the Inland region.

At the conclusion of our meeting, Dr. Salguero and board expressed an interest in one day visiting our club as well as Casa Colina to learn more about what advances are taking place within the field of neuro-optometry and low vision. Their club presented us with a banner and diploma in appreciation of our visitation. I anticipate that as a result of our recent visit to Lions of San Salvador, a long lasting professional relationship will evolve.

# HEARING & SPEECH ACTION NEWS



### **Hearing Restoration**

Of the many causes of hearing loss, those affecting the hair cells of the inner ear cause permanent loss. Located in birds and mammals, they resemble the hairs on your head. These cells convert sound information into electrical signals that are sent to the brain. Once hair cells die in mammals – including humans – hearing loss is permanent. The death of these cells has many causes, including noise-induced hearing loss, age-related hearing loss and oto-toxic loss caused by exposure to certain life-saving but toxic medications.

In the late 1980s research funded by Hearing Health Foundation discovered that even after chicken's hair cells were deliberately destroyed in the lab the cells grew back.. Recent research has shown promising leads that may overcome the lack of spontaneous recovery in the mammal. Gene therapy has resulted in patchy prototype hair cell formation in the mouse. These research results underscore the readiness of the field for an integrated effort to find the right combination of factors that will result in a functioning inner ear.

Today, laboratories are working on ways to translate to humans what we already know about hair cell regeneration in chickens. Studies in animals that spontaneously regenerate hair cells, such as birds and fish, are unveiling the important molecules needed to reach this goal.

A second approach is to transplant stem-like cells into the damaged ear that can give rise to new hair cells. Different labs are working gene therapies, stem cell therapies or possible ways to integrate both. When these labs are successful we will have a biological cure for deafness.


