On Saturday, March 10, 2012, Friends in Sight participated In a Sai Baba Health Faire at Corona High School in Corona, California. During this vision screening we screened a total of 522 patients which is an all time record number of patients seen in a one day screening. We arrived at the Faire at 7 am and did not break down at our home base until after 6:30 pm. We had the help of 55 Lion volunteers from 13 different area Lions Clubs during that long, long day.

During the January/March 2012 period, California Lion Friends in Sight provided 6 vision screenings all over Southern California ranging from Thermal to Moorpark and 4 more points in between. During these screenings 1,900 Patients were screened and 1,667 of those patients were fitted with recycled eye glasses. If you would like to see CLFIS 2011/12 YTD figures go to our web site *californialionsfriendsinsight.org*. Our web site is continuously updated with the previous and upcoming vision screenings.

Renee Schulte and her 4L4 Orange Region clubs continue to dominate eyeglass collections thru the month of March and also the 2012 Lion Year To Date figures.

Seal Beach Host collected a total of 3,261 eyeglasses for the month of March and also leads the YTD figures with a total club collection of 8,436. The Zone competition is led by Orange Region Zone "C" with 3,788 for the month of March and 11,988 for their YTD figure. Renee's Orange Region leads all 4L4 Regions with a combined effort of 4,290 for the month of March and a YTD figure of 21,210 used eyeglasses collected. This comes to a total of 4L4 for both LIONS IN SIGHT AND CALIFORNIA LIONS FRIENDS IN SIGHT eyeglass collections for the month of March 2012 to 6,724 and a YTD figure of 38,118.

Remember these eyeglass collections came from only 14 clubs out of a possible 37 clubs in our 4L4 District. Just think what would happen if we added the same average collections from the other 23 clubs.





Get in the Loop!

The Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA) is working hard to change the lives of consumers with hearing loss by supporting the installation of hearing loops in public spaces such as cultural centers, subway stations, airports and train stations, theaters and libraries – making it possible to participate in everyday activities and enjoy life!

Last June, internationally acclaimed composer, Richard Einhorn attended a sold-out looped performance of the musical "Wicked" at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington DC – sponsored by HLAA. Richard, who lost his hearing suddenly at age 57, said of the performance:

For the first time since I lost my hearing, live music was perfectly clear,

perfectly clean and incredibly rich."

What is a hearing loop? A hearing loop is a wire that circles an area and transmits sound that is picked up by the telecoil in a hearing aid or cochlear implant. Consumers report more satisfaction with their hearing aids when using the hearing loop. Today, telecoils are built into two-thirds of hearing aids and all cochlear implants.

HLAA is working hard to make public venues hearingfriendly for consumers with hearing loss through looping, captioning and other technology initiatives. But that is not all. HLAA is also advocating for:

- Ending employment discrimination for consumers with hearing loss
- Captioning of movies on the internet, cell phones and other hand-held devices
- Hearing Aid Tax Credit
- Changing the way society views hearing loss removing the stigma

Lions can be valuable partners in these efforts by lending support at any level.

Recent club activities are reported below.

Zone A - Chair Tamara Martin
