HOW LOUD IS TOO LOUD?

The Hearing Health Foundation provides this example chart of sounds that can induce hearing loss:

- 140-165 dB (Decibels) Firecrackers; Shotgun
- 140 dB Jet airplane taking off
- 120 dB Ambulance siren; thunderclap
- 110 dB Jackhammer; rock concert; symphony orchestra. More than one minute exposure at or above 110 dB risks permanent hearing loss.
- 105 dB MP3 players at maximum loudness; 15 minutes of exposure at or above 100 dB.

I would like to thank the Anaheim Lions for their donation of \$500.00 in memory of PDG Jack Luellen.


At the June COG in Torrance, Calif we were informed our District is # 3 in overall donations to the Foundation out of the fifteen District in MD4.


Zone A chair Hank Lopez.
















SEAL BEACH LIONS CLUB 2ND ANNUAL GOLF CLASSIC
