1 Project description

Guide Dogs for the Blind was incorporated in May 1942 and began training students in a rented home in Los Gatos, California. One of the first trained dogs, a rescued German Shepherd named Blondie, was paired with Sgt. Leonard Foulk — the first serviceman to graduate from the new school.

In 1947, the organization moved to its current 11-acre campus in **San Rafael**, and in 1995 expanded with a second campus in **Boring**.

Since 1942, more than **10,000 guide dog teams** have graduated.

Both campuses provide exceptional residential training facilities, including:

- Dormitory housing
- Dining facilities
- Exercise rooms
- Libraries and computer labs
- Social areas
- Real-world training environments from rural settings to congested city streets and public transportation

Mission:

To empower lives by creating exceptional partnerships between people, dogs, and communities.

Vision:

A world with greater inclusion, opportunity, and independence by optimizing the unique capabilities of people and dogs.
