




Lions Club Structure/Operations






- Globally there are about 750 districts with 35 or more clubs in each district.

Orient - SE Asia, India - South Asia - Middle East,






Multiple District A



History





- The official name of the association is "The International Association of Lions Clubs" or simply "Lions International."
- The name Lions was chosen on a secret ballot over several others because the lion stood for strength, courage, vigor and good fellowship.
- The Lions logo consists of a gold "L" on a blue field surrounded by a gold circle. On either side of the circle is the profile of a Lion's head, one looking back upon a proud past and the other looking optimistically toward the future.

In nearly 100 years of use, the Lions logo has changed and evolved. But it has always stood for the same idea: We Serve



1917: Note the visual pun in this early logo: a Lion and a club.

1920: This rendering with monogrammed L and back-to-back lions is the basis for the logo today.


