LIONS DISTRICT 25B DIABETES PROGECT REPORT

At the District Cabinet meeting on February 1st district Treasurer PDG Richard Hill reported that since PDG Freddy Bolton and other district leaders passed away the district had not been using the money it has in its Diabetes Project. PDG Freddy would typically request money from that district project to support the Matthew 25Health and Care Clinic in Fort Wayne. Other leaders in the northern zones woul also ask for money for a group in that area as well.

When I reported this to my Arcola Lions Club, our member Lion Lin Wilson volunteered to contact Matthew 25 to see how the district could help in the same way PDG Freddy did in the past. Their Director of Operations, Lauren Tosland, responded that some of the ways they support their patients in need are:

> Supplies: Blood Glucose strips, Blood Glucose Meters, A1C Test Kits.

Medications: Metformin & others!

At the district convention on March 1st I reported this information to the district. And I requested \$1,000 be donated from the district's Diabetes Project to Matthew 25. My request for a motion was bid up by district leadership that was aware of what the district had done for Matthew 25 in the past. After discussion and a call for a vote by DG Jim the District voted to give \$2,500 to Matthew 25.

In discussions I had with PDG Richard about this, and after reporting it to other clubs in my zone, I am also aware there are at least two other similar organizations in our district that the project could benefit. And those may be brought up at the district's cabinet meeting on May 17th at Bippus.

This district project is like some others that have been stagnant from our district's loss of GREAT leaders. But if we are resuming our SERVICE to these organizations I believe all clubs in the district should consider the DIABETES PROJECT when they develop their budget for the next Lions year.
