Hello Lions of MD 25,

Greetings to both our longtime members and our newest Lions! This month I have some good news—and a challenge—for us all.

The good news: as of September 20, Indiana is up 15 Lions for the year. The challenge: we're still behind where we need to be if we want to see real growth in 2026. Right now, Indiana has 7,823 Lions. A year ago, we had 7,987—124 more than today. That means despite some positive gains, we're still losing ground.

Here's the truth: if we wait for the "perfect moment" to invite someone to join, we'll keep waiting. And waiting leads to inaction. As someone who has battled perfectionism myself, I've learned a powerful mantra:

Done is better than perfect. What Can We Do Right Now?

Start simple: invite your friends, neighbors, and coworkers to join you at a service project. Notice I didn't say "Lions Club meeting." Service is the heart of Lionism—it's where people experience the joy, the purpose, and the fulfillment of being a Lion.
