#### Musings of the District Governor

For those who gathered in Huntington to hear ID Steve Thornton answer some of their questions as to what is happening at LCI and around the Lion community. During the Convention an opportunity was granted to elect a District Governor Elect and a First Vice District Governor Elect. Congratulations to PCC Jerry Zeigler and Lion Sandy Zeigler as they move up in the leadership of the district. The District Lions also elected some new members to all of the State Projects. During the convention time was taken to remember those Lions who have ended their service over the past two years.

Now we look forward the State Convention at the end of April to be held in Indianapolis and the fourth District Cabinet Meeting towards the end of May to be held in New Haven. We also look forward to greater activity by the clubs as the various restrictions are lifted and the weather improves. As we look toward the State and the International conventions LCI has stated that they will not look into a club's indebtedness to them to determine eligibility of delegates who get registered to vote.

However, this Lion year is not over. Some things we need to be looking at include but are not limited to club elections and reporting of officers for 2021-2022, developing and doing service projects and developing an annual budget for the club. Let's talk first about doing a budget for the year. The recommended way is to look at what the club has done over the last five to ten years and use that as a starting point. Then add or subtract fund raisers and/or service projects. This now gives the club some direction as to were you want to be. Officers for the Lion year 2021-2022 need to be reported to LCI by May 15th. As a minimum each club should have a President, a Treasurer, a Secretary and a membership chair.

One other area each of us need to look at is Membership. During this last couple of years, we have seen a sharp decline in membership. Part of this is because of the average age of our Lions. In the district the average age is 69 years of age. Many of our Lions have over 20 years of service. Also, many clubs have done the same fund raisers and service projects for the last several years. But the clubs have not done a member's interest survey or a community needs survey. Many members have been brought in but then they leave because they aren't made to feel wanted or needed. There are many helps available for working with member retention and member recruitment. There is training for officers both on line and in person offered and member orientation programs can be scheduled for a club with just a phone call. We do need to start thinking of new ways to recruit and new ways to serve. That does not mean to just stop doing what we have been doing in the past but to supplement the old with the new. As one PID I know once said, "If we fail to adapt our ways, we will fail to continue our service."

So, let us get out there and show the world that we are Lions and as such we are here to serve and lift up our communities.

Last August, Amirica contracted PANDAS, which is an acronym for Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorder Associated with

Streptococcus. PANDAS can "occur when strep triggers misdirected response and results in inflammation on a child's brain. In turn, the child quickly begins to exhibit life changing symptoms such as OCD, anxiety, tics, personality changes..."

A doctor who deals with this rare illness was located close to Cleveland, Ohio. Amirica and her parents have already made three trips to this doctor who feels that he can help. The cost of each medical treatment is over \$17,000. It may take more than one of these antibody infusions to eradicate the adverse symptoms.
