17-year-old high school junior, Amirica, is the daughter of Bluffton's Lions Club's President Mollie and her husband, Immediate Past President

Tommy Forbes. Biologically, they are not related to us, but District Governor Elect Jerry Zeigler and I consider them as a bonus addition to our family.

Last August, Amirica contracted PANDAS, which is an acronym for Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorder Associated with Streptococcus. PANDAS



can "occur when strep triggers misdirected response and results in inflammation on a child's brain. In turn, the child quickly begins to exhibit life changing symptoms such as OCD, anxiety, tics, personality changes..."

A doctor who deals with this rare illness was located close to Cleveland, Ohio. The cost of each medical treatment is over \$17,000. It may take more than one of these antibody infusions to eradicate the adverse symptoms.
