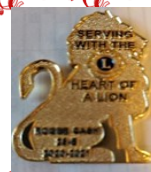

The locations are as follows.

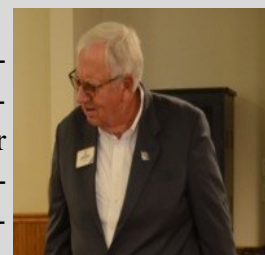
North: June 1 at Pleasant Lake Fire House, 1 West Main, Pleasant Lake, IN
