In case you haven't heard, the new Lions portal is online. The current timeline (subject to some changes) is:

- **Now – April 11:** MyLion, MyLCI and Insights will continue to function as normal.
- **April 12 and beyond:** MyLion, MyLCI and Insights are no longer available.

April 15 – May 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal sent via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users.

Please note: User permissions will not change. In other words, those who can report service, access member data and other key functions remains the same.

May 13 and beyond: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new Lion Portal.

If you haven't received an email from LCI yet, don't worry, it's coming. You'll know the one, because it will ask you to reset your password. Once you're in, take a look around. Some things are familiar, and other things aren't the same. I can't fully evaluate the site based on my limited navigation. I think things may be klunky for awhile, but eventually we'll figure out how to navigate the site and how to access the data we need to do our work as Lions. While someone may have moved our cheese, I'm confident that we can learn

to use the new system, it's just going to take a little time. There is a training module for the portal and I'm sure a lot of questions will be answered by completing the training.

Speaking of Training, there will be 3 different club officer training sessions offered in May. The training will be the same for all 3 with north, central, and south district locations. Presidents, Vice Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers, Executive Board and Membership Chairs should attend. Sessions will be in the evening, e-mail to incoming officers and e district 25B fb page will have locations and times.

Hello LCIF donors

As we continue to move down the pike toward year-end, our numbers continue to rise. I know that it's a busy time for clubs and Lions, but we're closing in on our goal slowly but surely.

About a week or two ago one of our district Lions asked about LCIF in Winchester Indiana. If you're as in-touch as I am, you're probably saying "ah yes, that tornado that hit Winchester on March 14th" or not really knowing the exact date, you have to look it up. Date aside, LCIF was in Winchester and provided an emergency relief grant of \$10,000 to provide for the needs of area residents following the storm. These emergency relief grants provide critical supplies to victims of storms and other events so they can have a small sense of normal life when nothing seems normal at all. While emergency relief grants get people up and running, follow on grants provide for larger and ongoing needs of communities. Between July of 2023 and March 2024 LCIF awarded \$7,399,407 in disaster relief grants and \$475,559.00 of that amount was granted in the US. The point is, YOUR LCIF donation made those grants possible. In case you've forgotten, 100% of your LCIF donation goes to helping our global causes. I've looked into a lot of causes, and I don't know of any other organization that distributes 100% of donations.

As of today, our district has raised \$20,011 of our \$27,324 goal, the end is in sight. If you haven't made your individual or club contribution yet, now is as good a time as any. When you donate to OUR FOUNDATION you truly do help make a difference in lives of people around the world and in our own back yard.

INDIANA LIONS FOUNDATION AT THE INDIANA STATE FAIR

The dates for the Indiana State Fair this year are August 2, 2024 through August 18, 2024.

There are a couple changes for this year.

Last year the Fair was closed on Monday and Tuesday each week; this year it will be closed only on Monday.

Automobile entrance to infield parking will be handled differently this year. In prior years, cashiers collected money for auto parking fees and entrance fees on the access roads. This year, only auto parking fees will be charged at the access roads. Four new gates are being created on the infield and Lions will sell and scan tickets at these new gates. On the website sign-in sheets they are designated at NW, SW, NE and SE gates.

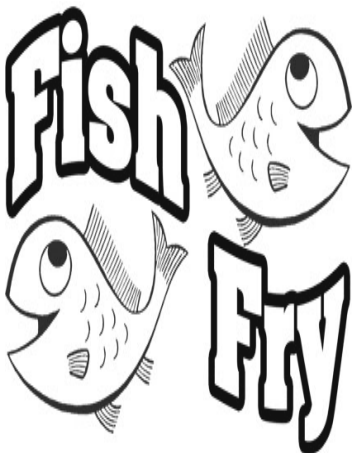
