In the last year, over 25,000 was given for emergency disaster grants right here in Indiana. I can't tell you the exact amount, but the requested amount is around \$26 and change per Lion. I know that may not be possible, for some, but others can give more. If you can give a little at a time, if you can fine 2.50 a month for a year, that would be \$30. I think if we all look at our discretionary spending and impulse purchases, that isn't very much. Another possibility would be adding the amount when paying your annual dues and forgetting about it until next year. The key is to have your treasurer write the check to "Empowering Service" so the donation makes it to the right place.
