Dear Club President,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care.

To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors unanimously passed another resolution to help our clubs.

Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

- Charter and entrance fees waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.
- Flexible payments No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 30, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.
 - □ Please note that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

Dear Lion,

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- Everyone's invited Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration fees The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- Current registrants Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- Elections Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- Convention updates Check our convention website LCICon for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time for our organization and the world, and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.

Update

Hello Lions,

This year, due to the limitations imposed by the COVID virus, our clubs may mostly be limited to offering MSU Extension D PATH virtual classes via zoom or providing diabetes educational materials to our local food pantries to qualify for use of the LCI Diabetes Grant money.

The D PATH classes are already approved and the prorated fee for participants from our District will be charged to us (and are free to the participant, including Lions and Lions' family members)**. We have received the approval to use grant funds to print MSUE's Navigating the Food Pantry with Diabetes, and other educational materials regarding diabetes. The PreDiabetes Risk Test is another document that could be printed and distributed around your communities.

Some clubs are hoping to hold diabetes screening events late this year (2021) and the possibility has been discussed with the Project Chairman. As far as we know at this time, there is no end date for this grant due to COVID. There is no way of knowing now if this will change. If an end date is re-established, I will notify you as soon as I know.

A promotional article about the Lions supported MSUE D PATH classes, two flyers for the classes (Feb/March and Mar/Apr--two different session times), MSUE Tip Sheet--Navigating the Food Pantry with Diabetes, and Prediabetes Risk test are all attached to this email. Leader Dog Happenings:

- 1) Back to Class: Providing In-Home Service- With an increase in COVID cases nationwide, we made the decision to continue guide dog and Orientation & Mobility training through home delivery for the months of December and January. We are monitoring the status of the pandemic closely and will make the determination to resume on-campus training as soon as it is safe to do so. When we resume, we will continue to adhere to the strict safety protocols we followed in the fall including: social distancing, 2:1 ratio of client to guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) versus the usual 4:1 ratio, and operating at 50% class capacity so we can use every other residence hall room.
- 2) TOM Talks: Summer Experience for Teens (camp for kids blind or visually impaired) went virtual this past year. It was so successful we will be rolling out TOM Talks. Based on the popular TED Talks podcasts, this will be Technology, Orientation and Mobility Talks. Designed for young adults who are blind or visually impaired, our focus will be on the next steps for independent travel, professional readiness, and networking. To accommodate busy schedules, this program is partially self-guided and partially live.
- 3) Virtually Connected: Please encourage clubs and districts to reach out to their Leader Dog chair/trustee or to the Lions Team at Leader Dog for a virtual presentation! We can share the Lions legacy with short virtual presentations to clubs and at district conventions. There have been two of the drawings so far, (no one up here won, including me!) but most drawings remain, and the grand prizes (\$1500, 500, 250) which will be drawn in May are still available. Clubs will receive \$5 of the \$20 purchase price back if they sell at least 10 calendars. Just contact the Foundation office if you want some calendars. Also if your club needs a fundraiser due to other events being canceled, Foundation raffle tickets are a great fundraiser. If your club sells 100 of the \$10 tickets, you will receive \$5/ticket back, and if you are really ambitious and can do 250 tickets, you will receive a rebate of \$5.50/ticket. My club has done well posting them on both the club and personal FB accounts- not that we will challenge either Oscoda or Alpena(!) ,but we had to cancel two fundraisers, so we are trying to get some of the tickets out to help our club so that we don't have to reduce our public service.

The Foundation will not be doing a raffle calendar next year, but we are beginning work on a Lions of Michigan cookbook, so if you have a great family recipe, let me or one of our district trustees (Dave Zeller and Chuck Brew) know about it. The book will be published in 2022, so you have time to think about it!

Ladies and Gentlemen.

Please share this information with your District Lions, local schools or and other community service organizations to evaluate the need for these certificates. I would like to utilize the 50+ Standard certificates that expire on 2/16/21 before they expire.

To issue a VSP gift certificate for a Student, the student should be considered needy, and we require a completed LMF - VSP Global Eyes of Hope - Eye Care Assistance Application, or at the minimum, we require the:

Child's Name — Child's Birthdate — Child's Phone Number — Child's Home Mailing Address

To issue a VSP gift certificate for an adult, we require a completed LMF - VSP Global Eyes of Hope - Eye Care Assistance Application.

We are pleased to be able to offer this program through partnerships with the Lions Clubs International Foundation and VSP Vision. Through collaboration with LCIF, caring organizations like VSP Vision, our Michigan Lions Clubs, schools and other community service organizations, we can help improve the quality of life in Michigan.

The meeting was called to order by DG Leathers at 7 PM.

New Business- DAD Funds -DG Rod reported that the East Jordan and Bellaire Family Health Care Centers requested a grant for \$1,200 to provide special glucose monitors for clients, but since it fell outside of the grant guidelines, the request was turned down. The Central Lake Lions, who are helping out in the Bellaire area after the Bellaire Lions folded, have agreed to pay \$600 toward the purchase, and the East Jordan Lions were asked to participate, but since fundraisers have been cancelled due to Covid, they were unable to help. Since the District medical fund has plenty of money, he asked if the district could cover the balance of \$600. It was moved by ZC McDonnell, supported by 2VDG Drury that we approve the request for \$600. Motion carried.

2021 District Convention - 2VDG Drury noted that 14 clubs had responded to the survey on whether the convention should be held virtually or in person. 2022 District Convention - It was moved by IPDG Zeller, supported by ZC Murch that the Boyne Valley Club be hosts for the 2022 convention. After consulting calendars, the probable date will be 4/29- 5/1/2022. Motion carried.

With no further business to conduct, the meeting was adjourned at 7:49 PM.

The COVID-19 Pandemic is not over. January was by far the deadliest month of the pandemic in the US, with more than 95,000 Covid-19 deaths reported.

The Coronavirus is changing and evolving - it's what viruses do. At least 4 Variants, virus mutations, have been identified. These Variants seem to spread more easily, are more transmissible, which can lead to increased number of cases and stress on our already overtaxed system.

As of now, the current vaccines are thought to be at least partly effective against new known Variants. Scientists most fear is that one will mutate to the point that it causes more severe disease, bypasses the ability of tests to detect it or evades the protection given by vaccination.

"Even if you've had coronavirus, there's a 'very high rate' of being reinfected with the new variants if they become dominant" – Dr. Anthony Fauci


It typically takes a few weeks after vaccination for the body to build protection (immunity) against the virus that causes COVID-19. That means it is possible a person could still get COVID-19 just after vaccination.
