## Greetings, fellow Lions,

Lions Clubs International (LCI) has several awards for individuals. The club excellence award recognizes clubs for their achievements. Clubs can qualify and apply for this award based on meeting several criteria during the Lions service year. The first criterion is achieving positive membership growth or sponsoring a new club. The service criteria include contributing to LCIF, starting a new service project and reporting at least three service projects. Leadership excellence requires a club to be in good standing, reporting club officers to LCI, having key officers participate in leadership training events and using tools to identify and implement improvements in the club. Finally, the club must publicize its service activities through local media and/or social media.

It was my pleasure to present this award for last year's achievements to the Hillman Lions Club which earned this reward in the 2020-2021 Lions year. The Central Lake Lions Club also received this prestigious award. Congratulations to them on achieving those milestones. This year there are eight 11E2 clubs which have membership increases to date, eleven which have contributed to LCIF and twelve who've reported service projects. All our clubs have reported club officers and four clubs qualify in all these categories with several more needing only one new member for positive membership growth. I know that next year's District Governor would be very proud to recognize several clubs with the LCI Club Excellence Award.

It's been a real highlight of my club visits to be able to recognize individual and club achievements in various areas. Please look at the club excellence award and consider whether your club could achieve this with a little added effort and the submission of an award application – this one would require District Governor signature.

I'm looking forward to hearing about your club's accomplishments as we go forward in service during these challenging times.



**DISTRICT 11-E2 NEWSLETTER** 

#### **District Organization - Cabinet and Officers**

The District shall have a District Cabinet composed of the District Governor, the Immediate Past District Governor, the First and Second Vice District Governors, the Global Service Team Coordinator, the Global Leadership Team Coordinator, the Global Membership Team Coordinator, the Region Chairpersons (if the position is utilized during the District Governor's term), the Zone Chairpersons, and a cabinet Secretary-Treasurer or a Cabinet Secretary and a Cabinet Treasurer. The members of the District Cabinet shall be the officers of the District. Each such officer shall be a member in good standing in the District.

CANDIDACY REQUIREMENTS FOR DISTRICT GOVERNOR. A candidate for the office of district governor shall:

- Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- .Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- Currently be serving as the first vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.
- Only in the event the current first district governor does not stand for election as district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of first vice district governor exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of second vice district governor and who is currently serving or who has served one (1) additional year as a member of the district cabinet shall fulfill the requirements of section c above.

CANDIDACY REQUIREMENT FOR FIRST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR. A candidate for the office of first vice district governor shall:

- Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- Currently be serving as second vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.
- Only in the event the current second vice district governor does not stand for election as first vice district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of second vice district governor exists at the time of the district convention any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of second vice district governor shall fulfill the requirements of section c above.

CANDIDACY REQUIREMENTS FOR SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR. A candidate for the office of second vice district governor shall:

- Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in is/her single or sub-district.
- Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:
  - 1. As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
  - 2. As zone chairperson or region chairperson or cabinet secretary and/or treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.
  - 3. With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.



LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION. Our district is a participating member of the Lions of Michigan Foundation with full voting rights and privileges. The district shall nominate and elect two (2) representatives from the district to serve on the Foundation's Board of Directors. We elect these Trustees for a two (2) year term with one (1) Trustee being elected each year. A candidate for the office of Lions of Michigan Foundation Trustee shall:

- a. Be an active member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in his/her district.
- b. Have served as President or Secretary of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof or as a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions club for no less than three (3) years.

## **COVID Update / DNA Discovery**

BRUARY

The COVID Pandemic continues to impact human activities around the world. Recent data, where we stand:

- In December, 2021, Omicron supplanted Delta as the prevalent COVID variant infector.
- While COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations are starting to decline across the United States, deaths are still rising, and community transmission is still high nationwide.
- As of January 27, 2022, more than 211 million people in the United States (67.6% of people ages 5 years and older) have received a primary series of a COVID-19 vaccine and are considered fully vaccinated.
  - More than 86 million people are up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines, which means they have received all recommended COVID-19 vaccines, including boosters.
  - O About 249,892,470 people, or 76% of the population, have received at least one dose.
- Two new CDC reports show that people who are up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines have the highest amount of protection against both the Delta and Omicron variants.
  - One report found that, compared to up-to-date adults, unvaccinated adults had five times the risk of infection and more than 50 times the risk of COVID-19-associated death.
  - A second report found that a third dose (either an additional primary dose or booster dose) of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna) was highly effective at preventing emergency and urgent care visits and hospitalizations related to COVID-19.
- New data in December 2021, supports the effectiveness of vaccines and boosters. Unvaccinated adults ages 65 years and older were 49 times more likely to be hospitalized for COVID-19 than people in that age group who were up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines.
- Preliminary data suggest that Omicron may cause more mild disease in most people, although some people may still have severe disease, need hospitalization, and could die from the infection with this variant. The presence and severity of symptoms can be affected by COVID-19 vaccination status, the presence of other health conditions, age, and history of prior infection.

We are now in the third year of the COVID-19 Pandemic, and the current COVID cases and deaths rates are about where they were at the beginning, despite the presence of vaccines. With the Omicron variant being 25% to 50% more infectious and nearly a quarter of the American population unvaccinated, COVID-19 will be impacting our economy, our health, and our lives for the foreseeable future.

## Our DNA's Ancient Secrets

Who we are and how we got here has been a compelling mystery in human cultures. Some answers were recently discovered: DNA, or deoxyribonucleic acid, is a long molecule that contains each person's unique genetic code. It holds the instructions for building the proteins that are essential for our bodies to function, the master molecule of every cell. It is the blueprint of what we are — what we look like, the color of our hair (and how much we have), how tall we become, the strengths and weaknesses of our bodies. DNA instructions are passed from parent to child, with roughly half of a child's DNA originating from the father and half from the mother.

The term DNA is popularly known through medical and law enforcement usage to determine paternity, identify a dead body, or to determine the identity of the perpetrator of murder or other crimes. However, DNA science has progressed far beyond these tools for such purposes, discovering much more about our world and the life that exists on it.

Neanderthals (Homo neanderthalensis) were very early (archaic) humans who lived in Europe and Western Asia from about 400,000 years ago until they became extinct about 40,000 years ago. Denisovans, distantly related to Neander-thals, are another population of early humans who lived in Asia. Denisovans were discovered recently (2008), so fewer Denisovan fossils have been found and scientists know much less about them. According to genome analysis in 2018 of a bone discovered in a Siberian cave; a female, who died around 90,000 years ago, had half Neanderthal and half Denisovan DNA, confirming that interbreeding between these ancient hominins occurred in some places.

Modern humans (Homo sapiens) appeared 300,000–200,000 years ago, and brain shape became essentially modern by at least 100,000 years ago. Research confirms that modern humans overlapped with Neanderthal and Denisovan populations for some time. The precise way that modern humans, the robust Neanderthals, and Denisovans are related is still under study. However, DNA research finds that their relation included interbreeding, as they had children together with both. As a result, most if not all people living today (except for native Africans) have a small amount of genetic material, from a trace up to 3% (perhaps more for some people), of DNA from distant Neanderthals and/or Denisovans. Now you know. As much as we've learned, there's still much more to discover to fill in the full picture of the story of us.


