Put Your Values Into Action

It is common for us to think about our place in the world—from who we are and who we want to be to how we can help others now and after our lifetimes. One way to find or rediscover meaning is by developing your own set of values to help guide your decisions.

Writing down your values can also help cement them, as well as offer a way to pass them on to the next generation.

Start Here

To begin, make a list. Write down six or seven of your most important values and how they help form your views and passions. Here are some starting-point questions as you reflect:

- Which qualities would you want people to say you possess?
- What would you like people to say about the way you live your life?
- What would you want future generations to remember about you?
- Which values do you share with the people and organizations you admire?
- How do you demonstrate your values in your daily life?

Take Action

Here are three ways to activate your values:

- 1. Go beyond words. Writing down your values can help cement them and turn them into a type of legacy letter you can share with your family but your legacy is more than words alone. If you're saving everything digitally, add a folder of images and videos that reflect who you are. Udpdate on Diabetes Resources

To Zone Chairs from District 11 E-2 Diabetes Chair

Hello Lions John, Jim, Steven and Don,

Good Monday morning to you all. I wanted to update you on the Diabetes resources we have for the District and to ask for your assistance in getting the word out to your clubs.

This year has been very challenging for doing any in-person meetings or activities. Because of that, the ability to use up the Diabetes Grant money pledged by all of our clubs (25%) and matched by LCI (75%) has been very limited. We have \$19,768.51 in the fund. At present, there is no end date to spend these funds; it was extended at least twice and finally eliminated. However, there has not been a definite answer from LCI about setting a new end date, so there may be some risk of waiting until group activities are allowed again.

The following categories are qualified for Diabetes Grant Fund money for our District:

- Portable tester kits (to be used for community diabetes screening events)
- 2. Nutritional training class (MSUE Dining with Diabetes was one)
- 3. Diabetes PATH classes (MSUE puts these on...virtually via zoom for now)
- 4. Train a Lion as a Diabetes Educator (\$100 per Lion)
- 5—7. Banner (promo to use during in person classes), Website, Miscellaneous (promotional ads, Public Service Announcements, printing, mailing)

Translation: MSUE DPATH classes via zoom, and printing diabetes educational materials to distribute to food pantries and PreDiabetes Risk Tests to print and distribute are ways we can use the grant money this year while COVID is restricting other activities.

I am attaching to this email the following:

- 1. February MSUE DPATH 6 week class zoom class info (first class Feb 18 and people can sign up until the start of the 2nd class on Feb 25)
- 2. March MSUE DPATH 6 weeks zoom class (2 different sessions--one day, one evening)
- 3. Sample promo article to submit to local papers

the first 3 attachments, above, will be in this email and the following email will contain the last 3, listed below

- 4. MSUE Tip Sheet---Navigating the Food Pantry with Diabetes
- 5. PreDiabetes Risk Test
- 6. MSUE presentation outline explaining the different diabetes education classes offered. They have offered to present, via zoom, to any Lions group, the present and proposed diabetes education programs. I plan to ask them if they can cut the presentation down to about 15 minutes, allowing 15 more minutes for questions and discussion. Hopefully, that might keep the whole thing to 30 min total.

I have been talking to Lion ZC Jim Broome, who is a member of my Lions Club, and have asked him to consider offering the MSUE presentation about their programs (#6) during a zone meeting, or in some way getting the info out to as many of our Lions as possible to work on Lions strategic objective: "reduce the prevalence of diabetes and improve the quality of life for those diagnosed." I am hoping all of you zone chairs may be able to assist in getting the word out to put the Diabetes Grant Funds to good use.



COVID Update: Vaccines

The first known death from COVID-19 in the US. occurred on February, 2020, in Santa Clara County in California, confirmed by post-mortem testing in death cases as the coronavirus was becoming a threat to the world. We are now in our second year of a Pandemic that is still impacting all of us on a daily basis – emotionally, socially, and economically. As I write this the cases and death curves have been dropping in previous weeks, but there are some areas where spiking outbreaks are increasing. We are not yet out of the woods, but we can hope that the new vaccines will soon begin to slow the COVID-19 spreading rate as more people have access to vaccination.

There are currently 3 approved vaccines available in the U.S:

- 1. **Pfizer-BioNTech:** Type mRNA; 2 shots, 21 days apart.
 - Clinical Trials: 95% effective at preventing laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 illness; considered fully vaccinated in 2 weeks after second shot.
 - Common side effects, mostly mild to moderate: Tiredness, headache, muscle pain, chills, fever, nausea
- 2. **Moderna:** Type mRNA; 2 shots, one month (28 days) apart
 - Clinical Trials: 94.1% effective at preventing laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 illness; considered fully vaccinated two weeks after second shot.
 - Common side effects, mostly mild to moderate: Tiredness, headache, muscle pain, chills, fever, nausea.
- 3. **Johnson & Johnson/Janssen:** Type Viral vector; 1 shot
 - Clinical trials: 66.3% effective at preventing laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 illness; high efficacy at preventing hospitalization and death; evidence suggests the vaccine may provide protection against asymptomatic infection; considered fully vaccinated 2 weeks after one shot.
 - Common side effects, mostly mild to moderate: Tiredness, headache, muscle pain, chills, fever, nausea.

COVID-19 vaccines help our bodies develop immunity to the virus that causes COVID-19 without us having to get the illness. Different types of vaccines work differently, but all types of vaccines leave the body with a supply of "memory" T-lymphocytes and B-lymphocytes that will remember how to fight that virus in the future.

COVID-19 **mRNA** vaccines instruct our cells to make a harmless piece of what is called the "spike protein" found on the surface of the virus that causes COVID-19. Once the instructions (mRNA) are inside the immune cells, the cells use them to make the protein piece, after which the cell breaks down the instructions and gets rid of them. They do not put a weakened or inactivated germ into our bodies, and mRNA never enters the nucleus of the cell, which is where our DNA (genetic material) is kept – so it can't affect our DNA.

Viral vector vaccines use a modified version of a different virus (the vector), not the virus that causes COVID-19, to deliver important instructions to our cells and then use the cell's machinery to produce a harmless piece of the virus that causes COVID-19 – the spike protein that is only found on the surface of the COVID-19 Coronavirus. This triggers our immune system to begin producing antibodies and activating other immune cells to fight off what it thinks is an infection, and remembers it for any future infection.

As of now, the vaccines seem to work on the variant strains of the Coronavirus. The worst problem with vaccines is that some people have allergic reactions to one of many components in the vaccine, and that can cause a serious health event. Keep that in mind if you've had some reactions with other medical vaccines.

Personal Experience: My wife, her brother, and I were vaccinated (Pfizer) first on January 26, and on February 16 for our second shot. Her brother had mild reactions to both shots, feverish and headaches. My wife had a mild reaction to the first one, but had more discomfort the day after her second shot – she felt sick all day, feverish, chills, headache, and very tired. The next day she felt totally fine. As for me, the worst thing was the sore arm where the shot was given, a little ache and slightly painful when touched. I had no discernible reaction to either shot. We all have different body chemistry and immune systems, and react accordingly.


