Board of Directors take steps to help our clubs

Year-Round Training Provided by the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum




The Lions University team met recently and started making plans for how to address the cancellation of the Louisville Forum. After some discussion the following decisions were made. This information will also be sent via emails to prospective graduates.

All Lions who have attended enough Forums to qualify for graduation from their respective programs will be able to graduate this year if applications requesting and documenting credit are submitted from the member's Lions University account by **July 15, 2020**. We will send a PDF copy of the certificate to the graduate and maintain the hardcopy certificates and the pins and make them available at next year's Forum. If you are unable to attend the 2021 Forum you can have someone from your state/district pick them up for you. You will be considered a 2020 graduate of the appropriate Program and will not be included in the 2021 graduation.

Some of you are taking courses in the different Programs with the intention of using this year's Forum for graduation requirements. We are working on a plan that may permit graduation on a one- time basis due to the extenuating circumstances of 2020. We haven't finalized these plans yet as we are waiting to see about other opportunities that the Forum Planning Committee is exploring. As soon as the Forum Planning_Committee finalizes these plans, we will make another announcement that will clarify this approach.

Step 1: Eligibility > Step 2: Criteria > Step 3:Recognize winners

Step 1: Eligibility

A total 20 awards this year will be awarded to 18 Lions clubs and, at minimum, two Leo clubs that:

- Are in active status
- Reported their project(s) in MyLion[®] or regional reporting system
- Did not receive the award within the last three fiscal years

Please note: During the test year (FY20-21) we will launch with 20 awards, with potential to expand in the future.

Step 2: Criteria

Award consideration will be given to clubs performing service that:

- Addresses the mission of the global cause
- Demonstrates creativity and innovation
- > Achieves impact of scale and long-term sustainability
- Develops local partnerships

- Uses local Lions/Leo or Lions Clubs International resources
- Is reported in MyLion[®] for the '19-20 fiscal year
- Meets the following nomination deadlines:
 - July 1 to October 31: Nominations are open
 - August 15: Deadline for club service chairpersons and Leo club presidents to electronically send one nomination to the district global service team (D GST) coordinator
 - September 15: Deadline for D GST coordinator to electronically send one nomination to the multiple district (MD) GST coordinator
 - October 31: Deadline for MD GST coordinator to electronically send one nomination to Lions Clubs International
 - January: Winners are selected by the Lions Clubs International Board of Directors Service Activities Committee
 - January 15: Winning clubs notified by this date
 - March 1: Winning clubs to receive their award from Lions Clubs International

Step 3: Recognize winners!

- Winning clubs will be notified by January
- Recognize the winner in your local Lions' or Leos' publications and social media outlets
 - This will help promote your club and create community support of your service events!
- > Prepare a press release announcing the winner.
 - Include a picture of the club in action at their service project!
 - Note the specific successes of the project.
- Ensure that the award is presented to the winning club at a prestigious event by the highest-ranking officer.
 - Invite the media to attend this event!

Program nomination process

Below, you'll find the program process for both Lions and Leo clubs, from nomination guidelines to expectations of various Lions and Leos at each step.

Lions and Leo awards

- The Lions club service chairperson will nominate their club for the Kindness Matters Service Award, which will need to be endorsed by the immediate past club president. The Leo club president will nominate their club for the Kindness Matters Service Award, which must be endorsed by the immediate past Leo club advisor.
- Nominations from the club level are sent to the District GST coordinator, which will then send one nomination to the Multiple District GST coordinator.
- The Coordinating Lion will submit nominations to Lions Clubs International if the nominated club is in an undistricted area.
- The Multiple District GST coordinator can recommend a Lions or Leo club for the award each year.
- Lions Clubs International staff will review the Multiple District GST coordinator nominations to recommend the approval by the Lions Clubs International Board of Directors Service Activities Committee.
- > It is recommended that the award be given to the club at a prestigious gathering.

Please note that all nominations should be submitted electronically. Lions Clubs International will not accept physical applications. A minimum of two awards will be awarded to Leo clubs. Please take all Leo club nominations into consideration when deciding which nomination advances to the next level.

Considerations

If your club does not have a club service chairperson to nominate your club, please have your club president or club secretary submit the nomination with the immediate past club president's endorsement. If the district or multiple districts do not have the GST coordinator position, the district governor and/or council chairperson would be the appropriate officer for advancing nominations to the next level.

Expectations for Lions and Leos involved in the nomination process

Lions club service chairperson/Leo club president:

- Begin the nomination process by downloading the nomination form and filling out the necessary information where applicable.
- Fill out the "Service Project Description" section of this form.
- > Seek out an endorsement from your immediate past club president.

- Electronically advance nomination form to the District GST coordinator once endorsement is received.
 - Be sure to follow up with the District GST coordinator to ensure they received your nomination.

District GST coordinator:

- Provide reasoning in the "Report" section of the nomination form as to why you believe that this club deserves to be nominated for this award.
- Endorse your nomination for the Multiple District GST coordinator.
- > Electronically send nomination to the Multiple District GST coordinator.
 - Be sure to follow up with the Multiple District GST coordinator to ensure they received your nomination.

Multiple district GST coordinator:

- Provide reporting data for this service project and indicate that it was reported in MyLion[®] or regional reporting system.
- > Endorse your nomination for Lions Clubs International.
 - Electronically send nomination to Lions Clubs International.

Editor's Notes



Social Distancing — Social Justice

The last month has seen the Covid-19 Pandemic graphic curve start to flatten as preventive measures in our nation continue to slow the spread of the Coronavirus. Oh, wait, that's what was <u>supposed</u> to happen...

What actually happened was a rush to open social and economic safety restrictions before Covid-19 was successfully contained. Encouraged, many people assumed they could "get back to normal", resulting in non-safe behavior – forgoing social distancing, gathering together into crowded situations, filling streets, beaches, and opened business establishments, mingling closely without masks with breathing – and some virus-infected breathing – human beings. Not what the doctor ordered, but what the virus needed.

Not surprisingly, the infectious illness experts' warnings of what would happen is exactly what is occurring now. Nearly every state has seen its Covid-19 numbers rise in the last few weeks. Some states have set records for the number of new cases for this Pandemic, far surpassing the April numbers that were supposed to be the peak amounts before the daily or weekly numbers started to drop. The U.S. daily numbers of confirmed cases hit a peak of 32,964 on April 24th. That remained the highest national daily number until June 24 when the day's total reached 37,945 new cases, trending higher than that every following day except one. On July 1st the daily total hit 52,609 cases confirmed, and was higher on July 2nd at 54,689. If the national increase continues to rise daily above 50,000, within 10 days a half million fellow citizens will be confirmed infected, reaching a million new cases in the next 10 days. Add another million 20 days after that. The dreaded scenario of overwhelmed medical facilities may yet occur.

This Pandemic spike has prompted most states to reinstate some safety restrictions and/or curtail plans to remove current restrictions. Many experts fear the genie is out of the bottle – it's only going to get worse until it gets better. Projected deaths may be much higher than originally thought. New York, California, Texas, New Jersey and Florida are the top 5 states for total cases, with many southern and western states right behind them.

Hard hit early on Michigan was 3rd in Covid-19 cases nationally. It is now number 13, with an average death rate currently at 9.3%. We've been lucky to be in Michigan, in the northern half of the state, where numbers may be rising now, but are still remarkably low. Good scientific guidance resulting in practical and necessary policies from state authority, and most importantly, the cooperative compliance of most citizens to do the right thing, like it or not, have curtailed the spread of Covid-19 until now. The influx of our summer residents and visitors, from less safety-restrictive southern states, many unaware they are virus carriers, threatens to set us back a step or two. Here in Emmet County, the confirmed cases reached 21 in April, and stayed there until a week ago. We now have 29 cases, and deaths still at 2.

Covid-19 is still confounding medical experts: New symptoms are being reported. Younger adults, children, and even infants are increasingly being infected. A baby was born and confirmed to have the virus, but the parents tested negative..? A woman contracted Covid-19 symptoms over 90 days ago, and is still sick. Earlier victims recovered, but got infected again. Survivors live, but with organ damage they didn't have before. So much we still don't know or understand. Individuals disregarding intelligent options toward safety are not only risking their lives, but the lives of everyone else, including us. Doubters dismiss Covid-19 is a "hoax" or "just the flu", but there are over a quarter million dead Americans who would dispute those fallacies. There is no vaccine for Covid-19, nor is there a vaccine for human foolishness. How this all turns out will depend on what we do and how well we do it. If we aren't patient now, we will have more patients later.

As Lions, we still help others, but we also need to be models of good practices, especially in this new reality of now.

As if the Covid-19 Pandemic isn't enough, an even greater centuries-old "Pandemic" continues to show it's ugly face <u>racism</u>. The past few years have seen an increase in hate crimes and police killings of unarmed black men. The unconscionable killing of George Floyd may be the straw that broke the camel's back. For 8 minutes and 46 seconds a police officer kneeled on the neck of the handcuffed man lying face down on the pavement – filmed by several eyewitnesses. Universal outrage from white and black people alike poured out into the streets, spawning protests in cities and towns across the nation. Most have been peaceful, a few were not. The scope and strength of this movement indicates Americans are fed up with racial injustice, prompting city, state and national governments to address and actually do something to change the flawed policies that lead to so many unnecessary deaths. Black people make up 28% of those killed by police since 2013 despite being only 13% of the population. All lives matter, but the point of "Black Lives Matter" is to enlighten us to the fact that too many black lives violently stop mattering.

The frustration in the black community is eloquently voiced by Christopher Harris, one of George Floyd's closest friends: "When you try so hard to put faith in this system, a system that you know isn't designed for you, when you constantly seek justice by lawful means and you can't get it, you begin to take the law into your own hands." It's time to end the systemic sickness of racism through acts of simple human compassion.
