

#### Lions News from International President Jung-Yul Choi

#### Dear Club Leader,

Due to the ongoing challenges presented by the coronavirus (COVID-19), the board of directors has voted to relocate the 2022 Lions International Convention from New Delhi, India to Montréal, Canada.

The ongoing travel and health advisories, and the size and complexity of our convention, led to this difficult decision. The board of directors also agreed to host a future convention in the beautiful city of New Delhi in a mutually-agreed upon year.

Unfortunately, this is not the first time COVID-19 has required our organization to make adjustments for the health and safety of our Lions, staff, vendors and local communities. In 2020, the board of directors voted to cancel the Singapore convention due to the government of Singapore restricting entry to the country. In January 2021, the 103rd Lions Clubs International Convention was transformed from an in-person event in Montréal, Canada to the organization's first virtual convention in response to the ongoing global pandemic.

We would like to recognize our Lions in India who are such an important part of our Lion family. They have been dealing with a very challenging moment in their country, like so many others around the world. We know that Lions are working there to safely serve their communities, and everywhere we serve. While COVID-19 has forced us to change the way we live, work and serve, we will continue to meet this challenge together.

We will be working to move ahead with planning our 2022 international convention in Montréal, which will take place from June 24-28, 2022. As plans come together, we will be sure to communicate them to the Lions of the world.

I thank you all for your perseverance through these unprecedented times.

#### **Jerome Thompson Message:**

We are in the final stretch of this fiscal year. The Lions of North America have worked so hard to flatten the curve of membership loss. Stand by for the results on June 30. But I am excited to announce through May, 2021, your hard work is paying off.

The North America Membership Initiative, which has been re-branded as the **Global Membership Approach**, focused on three key areas.



Through May 30, 2021 we have made progress over the first 11 months of the previous year.

**Rejuvenating Districts with New Clubs** - New clubs are up 61% with 17 more charter applications pending! We will expand our footprint of service into more than 140 new communities by June 30. Remember, new club charter applications submitted by June 20, with all necessary information, will be approved before June 30.

**Revitalize Clubs with New Members** – Since the pandemic restrictions were loosened beginning in March, we have added more than 5300 members. Working together, we can finish the fiscal year strong and start the year out stronger. Our ultimate goal is to add 4 new members per club each year. However, today, we shall celebrate a small milestone. While knowing that we will record a net member loss for the year.

**Re-motivate Members with New Service and Fellowship** - As of today, dropped members are down 16% over last year. We will have some June Drops. However, it appears that our focus on service, fellowship and fun is beginning to slow the revolving door.


#### **Alpena Lions JUNE 2021**

## Pandemic Data Update — And More

While the COVID-19 Pandemic has not yet been pronounced over and done, its numbers are diminishing in many areas of the U.S.and the World. Restrictions are being canceled in may states, but some precautions, once known as "common sense", are still suggested as prudent behavior in certain areas. Other updates:

- <u>Delta Variant</u>: The World Health Organization in May declared it a "variant of concern" with the increased evidence that the variant is more easily transmissible, causes more severe illness, and may reduce the effectiveness of vaccines or treatments.
- "We learned this virus, a variant of COVID is highly transmissible -- the most transmissible we've seen to date." — US Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy
- Dr. Fauci: The Delta variant is the "greatest threat" in the world's efforts to contain COVID-19.
- CDC: Delta Variant of the COVID-19 virus now accounts for 1 in 4 new cases nationwide.
- Long Haulers: At least 10% (with some estimates up to 30%) of COVID-19 sufferers are "long haulers", those who still haven't fully recovered from COVID-19. "Post COVID-19 Syndrome" incapacitates people for weeks or even months after symptoms first arose. There is no definitive answer as to how long the symptoms will last some last only 3 to 6 weeks, but others are still struggling to regain their health since the beginning of the Pandemic. Why some previously healthy, often young, adults 18 to 34 that suffered only mild or moderate symptoms still haven't recovered from the disease has stymied physicians and health experts. There's still a lot about COVID-19 we don't yet know.
- The 3 top countries in the world for COVID cases and deaths since the Pandemic began (July 5):
   U.S.A. 34,592,377 / 621,293 India 30,585,229 / 402,758 Brazil 18,769,808 / 524,475
- While the national COVID-19 new cases rate is dropping, there are are some areas that are rising
  in numbers. Unsurprisingly, States with below-average vaccination rates have almost triple the
  rate of new COVID-19 cases compared to states with above-average vaccination rates, according
  to new data from Johns Hopkins University.
- Vaccination Stats U.S.A. (July 2): At Least 1 Dose 181,339,416 55.2% Fully Vaccinated 155,884,601 47.5%
- Vaccination Stats Michigan (July 2): At Least 1 dose 5,149,074 51.6%
   (Vaccinations age 16+)
   Fully Vaccinated 4,719,220 47.3%
- Only 3 Counties in District 11-E2 have more than 60% of their residents vaccinated (July 6):
   Emmet County 66.26% Charlevoix County 63.48% Presque Isle County 60.28%
- If not enough people get vaccinated, health experts say, progress could be erased and COVID-19 could resurge in the winter. The COVID-19 virus will continue to spread as long as there are enough unvaccinated hosts to infect. The Pandemic will drag on, bringing sickness and death to the people of Earth. We have the knowledge, the science, to end the COVID-19 Pandemic; but the question that will determine our future is, will we take the actions needed to do so?


