Dear Lions,

I want to tell you about a young boy by the name of João Pedro. He had just been diagnosed with bone cancer and wasn't sure if he would see his 13th birthday.

When the day came, it was a total surprise when the hospital's nutritionist walked into João Pedro's hospital room with a birthday cake. He had just started his chemotherapy a couple of weeks prior, and was living at the hospital for his birthday. It could have been a dreary day, but instead, it turned into a celebration amongst João Pedro's family, the caring staff at the hospital, and the friends he made there. They shared a delicious chocolate cake and celebrated another year of life, something that perhaps had even more special meaning that year. "Thank you Lions, Leos, and LCIF, for giving the hospital the opportunity to better serve children struggling against an invisible and painful enemy. Many are winning the battle with your valuable help," says Fernando, João Pedro's father.

LCIF provided a US\$98,904 grant to update and equip the pediatric cancer unit where João Pedro received treatment. Fernando went on to talk about how he never had to worry about the hospital's resources, and all the staff, without exception, took care of his son with humanized care. He could feel the energy and the perseverance the staff had in order to provide excellent care.

It is stories like this that make me proud to be a Lion. Lions and LCIF are making a difference in the lives of children as they battle cancer and in the lives of their families as they support and encourage their children through treatments.

When you give, no matter what amount it is, it helps people like João Pedro; his father, Fernando; and his mother, Eliana. Please give what you can so Lions can continue to support the children in their community or the community of a neighbor.

## LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME OFFICIAL NOMINATION FORM

The LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME is a project of the Lions of Michigan Foundation. The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor those individuals who have had a significant impact on Lionism in Michigan and to preserve a memory and record of their service.

## **SELECTION**

A maximum of seven individuals may be selected annually for enshrinement into the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame. The inductees shall include up to four living and two deceased individuals. Past International Directors will automatically be inducted at the end of their two year term as International Director, and each year, one Hall of Fame inductee will be selected by a special committee consisting of the current members of the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame.

## **SELECTION COMMITTEE**

The primary Hall of Fame Selection Committee will be comprised of the members of the Lions of Michigan Foundation's Fund Development and Marketing Committee.

## **NOMINATIONS**

Nominations will be received annually, no later than March 1. All nominations must be made using the Nominating Forms provided by the Lions of Michigan Foundation. All portions of the Nomination Form must be completed in order for a nomination to be considered. A detailed Narrative for each Nominee should accompany the Nomination Form to provide the Selection Committee with additional information about the nominee. However, the Narrative shall have no numerical score.

Nominations may be initiated by an individual or individuals, a Lions Club or a District. Nominations must have the endorsement of the District Cabinet (**one nominee per category**) before they are submitted to the Foundation office. Individuals nominated and not selected, in any given year, may be nominated in a subsequent year through the endorsement of a current District Cabinet.

## **INDUCTEES**

Inductees and their spouse/guest will be invited guests of the Lions of Michigan Foundation at their scheduled induction ceremony. The time and location of the induction ceremony will coincide with the Foundation's Annual Meeting.

## **RECORDS**

The Lions of Michigan Foundation will be the official repository of records of the LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME. All records will be retained at the Lions of Michigan State Office.

## The Christmas Spirit

"Christmas is not a time nor a season, but a state of mind. To cherish peace and goodwill, to be plenteous in mercy, is to have the real spirit of Christmas." — Calvin Coolidge

Christmas, that "most wonderful time of the year" as the song goes, is fast approaching whether we're ready or not. Decorations and lights are in place in every city and town, and the engines of commerce are running at full speed. We are supposed to be filled with "**Christmas Spirit**", but what does that really mean?

The original religious Christmas was a celebration of the birth of Jesus, the symbol of Divine Light, Love, Peace, and Hope for Christian believers. While Biblical scholars contend that Gospel descriptions suggest the actual Nativity occurred in the Spring, the early Christian leaders proclaimed the celebration of Jesus' birth be held on the December date near the Winter Solstice to replace the pagan Roman holiday of Saturnalia. Traditional Christmas gift-giving echoes the gifts presented to baby Jesus by the 3 Magi, a.k.a. the "3 Wise Men."

Modern cultures have not only kept these traditions, they've greatly expanded them. A joyous time for many, Christian or not, Christmas is a time for parties, getting together with family and friends, vacations and expansive gift-giving. But not everyone is able to embrace the joy. Christmas can also generate stressful pressure to conform to Christmas expectations that are difficult for many to achieve. Emotional and monetary factors can lead to deep depression for those feeling lonely and/or overwhelmed by obligations they feel incapable of handling. The focus on commercialism has blurred the original meaning of Christmas Spirit, pushing mountains of "stuff" that seem essential, but aren't.

There is wisdom of the mind and wisdom of the heart, and it is from the heart that true Christmas Spirit flows. In my experience I've realized 4 major spiritual pillars that resonate for me: **Love**, **Forgiveness**, **Gratitude**, and **Joy**.

**Love** is more than an emotional attraction or feeling. It is the heart accepting the universe and everything in it, physical or spiritual. The opposite of fear, hate, and judgement, Love asserts that every human being has a purpose and deserves an equal chance to find happiness in his/her life's journey. In Love the act of giving to others is pure giving, not an obligation. Like the the proverb "Physician, heal thyself", we need to Love ourselves if we are to give Love to others.

**Forgiveness** is a release, a freeing of emotional baggage that keeps us focused on some past grievance, stuck with the negative feelings it brings up. This doesn't mean that those who have hurt us with betrayal, emotional or physical abuse, neglect, or any other great wrong are in any way "pardoned" for their actions. What happened happened, and there are consequences for all actions. We just don't have to carry negative feelings around if we forgive the past and live in the present. We need to forgive ourselves for our own mistakes as well.

**Gratitude** is being thankful for what we have. This is important, as so many focus mostly on what they want, and live in a dissatisfied feeling of lack. Appreciating what we have, physically and spiritually, helps us stay grounded in the present. Life and survival can be rough, but having gratitude for the phenomenal planet we live on can change our outlook positively, and make life more fulfilling and enjoyable.

**Joy** is "the emotion of of great delight or happiness caused by something exceptionally good or satisfying" (dictionary definition). It is in part the culmination of Love, Forgiveness, and Gratitude, all of which come from within the heart. Pure Joy is the the ultimate reward emotion we humans can experience, and life would mean little without it.

Embracing the Spirit of Christmas means having and sharing these characteristics, and more — having compassion, generosity, humility, not judging people and helping those in need. I've heard some people express the wish that the "Christmas Spirit could last all year long". Well, if you're a Lion, it does. Every act of Service that Lions do is an act of love, forgiveness, gratitude, joy, compassion, generosity, humility, and lack of judgment. We Serve those in need through Diversity and with Kindness. If that isn't true Christmas Spirit in action, nothing is!
