With Andy now a member of the club, Bernie III said, "The Lamp family has always taken pride in living out the Lions Club motto of "We Serve". I am proud of Andy as he carries on our family legacy of community service, started by his great grandfather, carried on by his grandfather, and passed along to me."

OSCODA LIONS


