Dr Hill is a founding member of the Lions of Canada Consultative Committee.

In recognition of her service to the association, International President Hill has received numerous awards, including several International President's Awards. She has been honored with the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and recipient of numerous other fellowships.

In addition to her Lions activities, International President Hill is active in numerous professional, human rights, and community organizations. In the past, she served as an executive officer of the Alberta Association of School Psychologists and the Association of Canadian Educators of the Hearing Impaired. International President Hill has also served on the Alberta Premier's Council on Persons with Disabilities.

International President Hill and her husband, Greg Holmes, also a Lion, enjoy time with their family which has grown to include Pieter, Carley and grandson Alexander, Erin, Mike and granddaughter, Violet, and Jessica and Mitch.



Phillip Demond Fletcher Founder and Director The City of Hope Outreach

Phillip Demond Fletcher is married to Nicolle Fletcher and is the proud dad of Nicollus, Najee and Nichelle. Phillip Fletcher has been a resident of Conway, Arkansas since April 2007.

He is the founder of Arrowmaker, a brand dedicated to the ideas of a personal God, human dignity, freedom, self-determination, and responsibility to advance human flourishing of individuals living in proximity to each other in our world. He is the founder and executive director of The City of Hope Outreach (CoHO), a 501 (c) three non-profit in Conway, Arkansas. The mission of CoHO is to provoke hope in individuals, families, and communities for the glory of God. Through initiatives such as CoHO Academy, Hope Home, Hope Village, and CoHO Cares; CoHO has sought to be a catalyst in promoting the philosophy that people should primarily care for people freely with grace for God's glory.

He seeks to address issues of leadership, the local church and social engagement through the lens of the Gospel. He is the author of the book, The Excellence of God: Essays on Theology and Doxology published by Cross books, Created in Freedom: Poverty and Economics published by Ingram Spark, and Angst and Hope: Protest, Pandemic, and Politics published by Amazon. In 2013, he launched, "Humanity Matters," a podcast to stimulate honest discussions on what it means to be human in a difficult world. In 2015 Governor Asa Hutchinson appointed him to the 20th Judicial District Criminal Detention Facilities Review Committee. In 2016 he hosted the AETN-PBS television program; A Deeper Look: The Poverty Divide in Arkansas. In 2017, Mayor Bart Castleberry appointed him to the City of Conway Homeless Task Force. In 2019, he assisted in the launch of the UCA-CoHO Poverty Studies Group which conducts research and experiential learning concerning poverty in the state of Arkansas. In 2021, OArkansas Money and Politics recognized Dr. Fletcher as one of Arkansas' Top Professionals. Finally, he serves as an adjunct professor at Philander Smith College, a Historically Black College located in Little Rock, Arkansas.

A native of Louisville, Kentucky, Phillip Fletcher received his Bachelor of Arts in Ethnic Studies from the University of California at Riverside, his Master of Arts in Theology and Apologetics from Liberty University, and doctorate in Organizational Leadership from Regent University.0
