Kathy Singleton recently emailed Lions Clubs International. When she was a first-grader in Springfield, Missouri, the Lions club bought her first pair of glasses. "I still remember the joy I felt when I was able to distinguish that trees had individual leaves. It excited my heart to learn to see the world in its

infinite beauty," she eloquently wrote us. "I pray y'all continue blessing many other kids like y'all did me."

Yes, Ms. Singleton, for the next 100 years, we will keep on helping children as well as adults as we have for the past century. In our Centennial year, we want to honor and remember the past as well as move our great Association forward.

During our long history Lions not only reached out to individuals but also often impacted entire communities. After an earthquake and tsunami devastated Afognak, Alaska, in 1964, Lions built a new town for residents. Five years earlier in the tinder-dry cattle country of Texas, their town regularly threatened by prairie fires, Leakey Lions started a fire brigade including a fire truck. Long ago in 1925, alarmed by the inadequacy of schools, York Lions in Pennsylvania began a well-stocked circulating library. The pages of the LION from the last century are filled with tens of thousands of such examples of life-changing and often life-preserving service.

Our Centennial service goal is to serve at least 100 million people by June 2018. We are on pace to shatter that goal. Please have your club "join the party." AROUND THE MD, CLUBS ARE WORKING WITH VISION SCREENING

(editors note: I contacted all DG's asking them to send me Information about their District, unfortunately I did not hear from all of them, so this is an incomplete picture)



Hope Lions Club purchased vision screening devices which they presented to the elementary schools

Hot Spring Village is busy with vision screening— I'm not sure which Club or if it is both.

Bella Vista/Bentonville Breakfast Clubs screen throughout the school year last year more than 1000 students were screened.

Bentonville Noon Club has been screening with an older device (now broken) and have applied for a new vision screening device.

Russellville has a vision screening trailer that is air-conditioned with dark rooms available for screening. They can go to all events and not depend on having a good room available.

Fayetteville has a vision screening team which is very active.

Conway Noon Club has two vision screening devices which keep busy with their screening schedule —320 since July Pea Ridge has recently received a screening device and are scheduling their screening.

Two clubs in District 7-O are using their SPOT vision machines to check folks ranging in age from 6 months to 96 years of age. The Jonesboro University Heights and Heber Springs Lions Clubs are keeping their vision chairs busy checking eyes from West Memphis to Black Rock. Most of the screenings have been done at locations where local Lions Clubs are holding an activity. The Heber Springs Club has checked eyes at 6 pre-school centers for the last 2 years. In the short time the SPOT machines have been in use, over 3000 folks have been checked
