
### MD7 GLT

### STRATEGIC PLAN FOR MD7

### Yes Lions, there is a plan!

Most travelers know that the best way to reach a destination is to have a route mapped out for how best to arrive there.

Similarly, reaching goals is best done if one has a well thought out plan for achieving them.

Many Arkansas Lions may not be aware that one of the last actions of the 2011-2012 Arkansas Lions Council of Governors was to adopt a MD-7 "strategic plan" outlining a series of both short and long term goals to be worked toward in eight key focus areas as follows:

Membership Retention & Growth
Leadership & Organizational Development
Public Relations & Marketing
Technology
Service
Strategic Planning & Implementation
Youth Involvement
Financial Responsibility

Short (0-2 yrs) and long (3-5 yrs) objectives/goals were adopted under each area to provide guidance to Arkansas Lions on ideas for projects, activities and tasks they might choose to tackle and thereby move the plan forward.

All Lions are encouraged to review the plan in its entirety and then develop club actions that, once executed, would contribute to achievement of one or more of the established goals.

Examples might include developing a free club website via the LCI e-clubhouse function or setting up a club Facebook page (Technology), holding an *Ask One* membership drive aimed at adding members (Membership Retention & Growth), starting a new community service project (Service) or sponsoring a new Leo club (Youth Involvement).

To support Strategic Plan awareness and implementation the Council also established new leadership positions of state Strategic Plan Chair and corresponding chairs within the District level leadership group. These positions were charged with educating Lions on the plan and providing support to clubs in working to achieve the goals it sets forth.

So let's all work together to get to our destination by looking over the plan and developing ideas for actions that would help move the plan forward! If you need assistance or have questions you are encouraged to contact your District Strategic Plan chair or the state level chair whose contact information should be available in the 2014-15 Arkansas Lions directory.
