AVIEW FROM THE CHAIR

Greetings once again Arkansas Lions! Can you believe that we are almost thru the first half of this 2014-2015 LION Year? As the hustle and bustle of the holidays approach, I would like for you to take a moment and consider

HOW LIONS CAN HELP FEED THE HUNGRY IN OUR COMMUNITY.

As your District Governors have made their annual visits to each of the Clubs this year, I anticipate that they probably included the LCI "Global Service Action Campaigns" in their presentations. These are Lions' humanitarian projects, which every Lions Club can participate in. One of those campaigns is the "Relieving the Hunger" program.

According to the most recent U.S. Department of Agriculture research report, "Household Food Security in the United States", an estimated 85.7 percent of American households were food secure throughout the entire year in 2013, meaning that they had access at all times to enough food for an active, healthy life for all household members. The remaining households (14.3 %) were food insecure at least some time during the year, including 5.6 percent with very low food security, meaning that the food intake of one or more household members was reduced and their eating patterns were disrupted at times during the year because the household lacked money and other resources for food.

We, as LIONS, can impact this need in our own Communities and beyond.

LIONS have an opportunity to show the strength of our worldwide network during a special service action campaign, "Relieving the Hunger".

During the months of November, December 2014 & January 2015, we urge the Clubs in Multiple District 7 to join LIONS around the world to help relieve hunger.

Organize projects that mobilize your Club members to make a difference in your local community – by helping those who don't have enough to eat.

If your local food bank/pantry does not have volunteer opportunities available, you may wish to consider other service projects such as preparing and delivering food baskets to families in need.

There may be an opportunity to work with your local government agencies to plan and develop a community vegetable garden. Planting and maintenance may be one way of serving families, who do not have the funds and/or land to put in a garden of their own.

News Release: Send a news release to all of your local media (radio, television and newspapers), as well as social media (Facebook, etc.), to help publicize your "Relieving the Hunger" project/event.

Report your Club's activities! Be sure that your Club Secretary submits your relieving the hunger efforts on your Club's monthly <u>Activity Report</u>, which will also be included as part of the <u>Centennial Service Challenge</u>. Please be sure to include your number of Lion volunteers, the hours of service & some statistics of how much food was collected and/or the number of families helped. Also, please submit photos of your event. Lastly, we ask that you please send all of your info. to your District Governor's Team, so that your project can be shared with the rest of your District. Who knows, you may have a project that other Clubs may want to mimic! Thanks again for all you do, as LIONS!!

As I always say, "If It's Meant To Be, It's Up To Me...and YOU." We will be anxious to hear about who will take that next step...


