Lions Clubs International Foundation Receives Humanitarian Grant from the Anthem Foundation

The \$250,000 Lions-Anthem Foundation Healthy Heroes Grant will support projects that promote healthy and active lifestyles

Oak Brook, IL, September 16, 2015 – The Lions Clubs International Foundation announced that it has been awarded a \$250,000 grant from the Anthem Foundation to create the Lions-Anthem Foundation Healthy Heroes initiative to help improve the health of communities across the country.

This new grant will support Lion-led humanitarian projects in late 2015 and early 2016 that promote healthy and active lifestyles. From positive youth development to empowering individuals with disabilities to become more independent, grants will be awarded to Lions clubs and districts with programs that support improved health outcomes.

"At Anthem we are committed to supporting community initiatives that help create a healthier generation of Americans," said Lance Chrisman, executive director for the Anthem Foundation. "We're proud to join forces with Lions Clubs International Foundation, and the hard working Lions who are serving throughout the country, to improve the communities we all call home."

The grant will also support a month-long, joint community service event later this fall to benefit local communities across the country.

"This partnership is a great example of what can be achieved when partners work together to strengthen their local communities," said Lions Clubs International President, Dr. Jitsuhiro Yamada. "Lions are looking forward to working side by side with the Anthem Foundation to help serve communities across the United States."




# SOME FACTS YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION:

- \* Last year Lions Clubs and individual Lions contributed over \$39 million to LCI F. That was an increase of over \$3 million over the previous year!
- \* Last year 50% of Lions clubs in the US made a contribution to LCI F.
- \* Last year only 30% of clubs in MD-7 made a contribution to LCI F.
- \*Thanks to LCI F over 250 million children have been vaccinated against measles in Third World countries.
- \* Still, over 300 children per day die from measles!
- \* For just one dollar a child can be immunized against measles for life, making the vaccine potentially the most cost-effective health intervention available!
- \* Last year WSB received a grant from LCI F for \$319,400! This grant enabled WSB to expand its training programs by offering two new programs. These two programs are call center operator and medical coding specialist.
