We pay for blood glucose testing supplies (monitors, test strips, lancets), oral medications, insulin and syringes.

## WARNING SIGNS FOR DIABETES

#### TYPE I DIABETES

# (Symptoms develop rapidly)

- Frequent urination (including bedwetting in children who have been toilet trained)
- Excessive thirst
- Extreme hunger
- Sudden weight loss
- Weakness and fatigue

#### TYPE II DIABETES

# (Symptoms develop gradually)

- · Any of the symptoms above
- Blurred vision or any changes in vision
- Tingling or numbness in legs, feet or fingers
- Slow healing of cuts
- Frequent skin infections or irritations
- Drowsiness

See your physician for any of the symptoms above, concerns, or if your family has a history of diabetes. Specify your desire to be tested for diabetes...do not assume that your blood sugar is being tested. Ask your doctor for the normal glucose values and what your test results mean.

We encourage you to have your blood sugar checked if you are...

- Overweight
- · Have a family history of diabetes
- · 40 years of age or older
- · African American
- Hispanic
- Native American
