

Newborn hearing screening: Hearing helps a baby to talk. If hearing loss is discovered early, babies have the best chance of learning to speak and doing well in school.



In 1999, only 8% of babies born in Minnesota were screened for hearing loss. Together with their partners, the Department of Otolaryngology at the University of Minnesota, the 5M Hearing Foundation established the Lions Newborn Hearing Screening Program. Within five years, every baby born in Minnesota could be screened for hearing loss —that's about 70,000 children every year! In 2007, newborn hearing screening was mandated and the Lions Newborn Screening Program was handed over to the Department of Health.

If your baby does not pass the first hearing screen, it does not mean he/she has a hearing loss. Some common reasons are:


- birth debris in the ear canal
- fussy baby
- too much noise in the room
- middle ear fluid

Nonetheless, it's important to schedule a follow-up screen.

Speech and Hearing Milestones to watch for:

- around 0-3 months
 - startles at loud noises
 - o reacts to a familiar person
 - o makes "coo" or "aah" sounds
- around 3-6 months
 - stops playing when sound is heard
 - o reacts to his/her name
 - o babbles
 - laughs when happy
- around 6-9 months
 - o turns head to source of sound
 - responds to "no" and facial expressions
 - o says "mama" and "dada"

Can Do Canines Open House Scheduled for March 25

Can Do Canines invites you to attend an open house on Saturday, March 25, from Noon to 2 p.m., at its Can Do Canines campus (9440 Science Center Drive, New Hope, Minnesota.). Potential clients, volunteers, or anyone who might be interested in supporting the organization are invited to attend to learn how an assistance dog changes the life of a person with a disability.



Through a self-guided tour, attendees will be able to watch a trainer working with an assistance dog, hear from a volunteer puppy raiser, talk with volunteer staff members, pose questions to client services coordinators about the application process, and meet graduate teams from each of the five types of areas Can Do Canines trains dogs: hearing, mobility, seizure, diabetes and childhood autism. The assistance dog demonstrations will be held at 12:30, 1:00, and 1:30, and the puppy raiser will speak at 12:15, 12:45, and 1:15.

There is no pre-registration for this event, though attendees will be asked to share some contact information when arriving.

LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The Lions International Trading Pin Club (LITPC) has announced for the 2022 – 2023 school year that there will be 4 US \$2,500 scholarships awarded. Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of Lions are eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The LITPC goal is to help our future leaders and give students a financial helping hand. This program started in 2012. Recipients have been from Connecticut, Delaware (2), Georgia, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota (3), New York (3), Ohio (3), Oklahoma (2), Pennsylvania (2) and Virginia (5). The 2023 recipients will be announced at the LITPC Pin Traders Annual Breakfast in June, 2023.

Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) AND attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located.
