District 5M4 Lions

I've heard it said "the days go slow, but the years go fast!" Boy, is that true for 2023. I can't believe 2024 is here and we are busier than ever. It's been a whirlwind of club meetings, events, service projects, holiday parties, and preparation for the 2024 5M4 Mid-Winter Convention. Thank you all who have hosted us, entertained us, and fed us. It's been our pleasure to meet with you. On top of our Lions events, PDG Bob and I have been extra busy this time of year with all of our Santa visits to communities around the state. Add to that our new Leader Dog puppy, Trooper! Needless to say, we'll be staying home for Christmas and enjoying catching up on some much needed rest.

In this issue of the 5M4 Newsletter, you'll find a LOT of information about the

Mid-Winter Convention. There are many ways to participate. The most obvious is to simply attend! We have many wonderful things planned – but overall the main thing we want to do is get together with our Lions friends and have fun! The theme of "Made in Minnesota" is allowing us to do just that. Elsewhere in this issue, you will find a draft of the agenda so you can see all the fabulous speakers, panel discussions, entertainment, and even the food will be a Minnesota theme. Be sure and check it out.

Our service project is going to be pretty significant too. Following IP Patti Hill's lead regarding focus on the environment, we will be doing two separate projects.

The first – we will be collection/recycling a whole list of things: glasses, hearing aids, shoes, plastic (bags and others), and now we are adding cell phones. Dig through that junk drawer and find all your old phones. Bring even without chargers or if they don't currently work. We will be turning them over to an organization that will get them working and provide them at no cost to families in trouble who may need to call for help.

The second – thanks to an LCIF Community Grant, we will be purchasing wildflower seeds in bulk and dividing them into small seed packets. These can be planted in your personal yard next spring, or your club could plant them all together in a community garden.

The plastic we collect will be turned into Cub Foods in Willmar which will in turn be converted into a park bench constructed by the Trex Company. This particular bench will be donated to the Willmar Noon Lions Dog Park in our host community. This program is available for YOUR CLUB in YOUR COMMUNITY and information will be on hand to take home.

Speaking of the Willmar Noon Lions, another feature will be the transportation service project they have ongoing in their community. Lion Terry Smith will be on hand with the Lions Van to tell you more about how they got things "rolling" and how they have sustained the project.

Something else that's new, the Minnesota Lions Gift of Sight is promoting becoming donors and they are making it very easy to sign up. They will be on hand.

All of the Foundations and other organizations we support will have table displays for you to check out and talk with our Cabinet Chairs on what is the latest information.

That leads me to the Parade of Green. I've already been receiving checks for the Parade of Green and we appreciate everyone's support. There is a list of ALL the organizations that are included in the Parade of Green within this newsletter. Please give generously as you always do. 



Spicer Sunrise Lions have been busy with vision screening in preschools, including the YMCA Childcare center and the Praise and Play preschool at Faith Lutheran Church, and NLS public schools. So far Lions have screened 1028 young people finding 69 who should see an eye care professional. The Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screener used by Lions can detect 7 conditions commonly found in children starting as young as 6 months of age. The goal for Lions is to catch vision issues before they can hamper the child's education. Some conditions can become permanent if not treated early enough. On going screening takes place at Prairie Meadows when 3 and 4 years olds come for preparation for kindergarten. Helen Keller charged Lions to be the Knights of the Blind, thus vision is one of the major projects for Lions. The Spicer and New London Lions work together to provide the service free of charge.



"Preparedness, Response, Recovery, and Relief in relation to a disaster, The Objective : means measures taken during or immediately after a disaster in order to bring relief to people and communities affected by the disaster".

• PreParedness involves the development of a plan of action in case of emergency. A logistic operations center and a practiced emergency response plan are two elements of the preparedness phase. Lions Clubs continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercise, evaluation and improvement activities to ensure effective coordination and the enhancement of capabilities to respond to incidents or disasters

• resPonse includes the mobilization of Lions Clubs and Lions Alert Coordinators. They should be prepared to do a rapid needs assessment and bring Lions to where they can do the most good.

· recovery aims to restore the affected area to its previous state, such as rebuilding destroyed property, infrastructure. Recovery can be immediate and/or can be longer term depending on the situation. Relief can come in the form of providing food and drink to recovery workers and affected people, working with other agencies, assistance in long term recovery

Be sure to fill out **ALL** the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a **certified** copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) **AND** attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located.
