'You have changed a life'

From DG Marty

One of the amazing things that we get to do as Lions, is help those who are less fortunate than ourselves. We get to have an effect on the lives of people who we do not know or may never get the chance to meet.

> I'd like to tell you a story about a family who are pretty special to Karla and me.

My niece Kelly is married to Craig Mahan and they have 2 awesome daughters, Lillie and Madison. After birth it was discovered that Lillie was born with a cataract on her left eye. At 6 weeks old she underwent surgery to remove it at the Lions Childrens Eye Clinic. Surgery left her without a lens on her eye. Since then at 2 years old



she got her first pair of glasses, she has also worn a contact on her eye. The strength of that contact was between a +32 and a +26 (this was adjusted as she grew).

Recently, she returned to the Childrens Eye Clinic to have a muscle correction along with a lens implant. She no longer needs to wear a removable contact, but will still continue to wear glasses. Without this surgery, her brain would not have connected with her eye, leaving her with no vision at all in that eye. She now has limited vision in her left eye. With the new lens and glasses she will still be legally blind in her left eye, however her outcome is projected to be on the higher end of the spectrum considering her circumstances.

I love to tell people how fortunate we are as Lions, because of the lives we get to change. Most of you will never know my niece or her family, but because of your generosity, your willingness to help, your commitment to what Lions do, you have changed the life a young girl.




