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
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# 'Let's go team!'

September 2021 the Pearland Silverlake Lions Club (above) held their first "Helping Hounds, A benefit for Leader Dogs for the Blind" at Killen's Steakhouse in Pearland, Texas. Over 70 attendees and volunteers enjoyed a dog friendly evening on the Killen's Steakhouse Patio dedicated to helping raise money for this worthy cause.

The idea of a fundraiser just for Leader Dogs for the Blind was brought to our club by Lions Charise Berry and Sandy Cavazos. The pair decided our club could make an impact if we could donate enough to pay for one puppy to be purchased and trained to be a Leader Dog. The board thought the idea was great and planning began.

Sponsorships were created with names like Hair of the Dog and Best In Show ranging from \$250 to \$2500. There was a dog costume contest as well.

The event resulted in a \$20,000 donation to Leader Dogs for the Blind which will be used as a "Lions club donation match" mail campaign hitting club mailboxes early April.

## Community in Clara City, Minnesota

I'm so proud of the ingenuity that came out of this club in my home district. It will make such a difference in the day-to-day lives for the members of the senior community. It's great to see everyone come together for a common cause. It makes me even more proud to be a Lion.

Thanks to a LCIF Matching grant, residents in International First Vice President Brian Sheehan's District 5M-4, Clara City, Minnesota, are feeling a revived sense of community. LCIF Matching grants involve identifying what a community needs most, and making it a reality. The US\$65,000 grant funded an accessible playground near the Clara City Care Center for assisted living. It includes wheelchair swings, spinners, and other accessible play structures

The idea was born after Lion Laurie Dieken, President of the Clara City Lions Club, brought her grandson to visit her mother-in-law at Prairie Park Place, a senior residential community, and realized he had nowhere to play outside.

Dieken and her fellow Lions quickly went to work to meet that need. Between planning and fundraising, the project took three years to complete and brought the entire community together to help build the park because of their love for kids. The park has brought enjoyment to residents of all ages.

At the park, one family placed two picnic tables to be able to sit and watch their children as their elderly parents looked out of their window to watch the children play. The tables remain for others to enjoy the experience as much as they did. As the children play, residents can gather at these tables to visit with them, encouraging intergenerational friendships.

"That ongoing care, as part of the Lions legacy, warms the heart and the soul," Dieken said.

**Kelley's Story** 

(not her real name or photo)

Born deaf in her left ear, little Kelley went through numerous tests to figure out the cause of her hearing loss. Because she appeared to be otherwise healthy, her doctors suspected a genetic or structural issue was to blame.

But when Kelley also showed signs of a delay in her gross motor development at 2 months of age, a special education teacher who works with infants with hearing loss wondered whether **cytomegalovirus** (CMV) was instead responsible.

CMV is a herpes virus that most women of child-bearing age have already acquired. Pregnant women who are infected with CMV rarely have symptoms, but rather their developing baby may be at risk for congenital (meaning from birth) CMV disease. CMV Exposure in Pregnancy

Kelley's pediatrician thought CMV was unlikely to have caused her hearing loss. But her parents pushed to have her tested. At 10 months, through retrospective testing of a blood sample given at birth, they learned Kelley had been born with CMV.

Together, the physician and Kelley's parents decided to put Kelley on a yearlong course of antiviral medication in hopes of preserving the hearing in her right ear and minimizing the wrath of CMV on her developing body.

So far, 4-year-old Kelley is meeting developmental milestones and will be monitored closely as she grows. With the help of weekly speech therapy and regular audiology visits, Kelley has amassed a substantial vocabulary and is working hard on articulation. She loves chasing her 5-year-old sister around the house, helping in the kitchen, and singing "Let It Go" (from the movie "Frozen) at the top of her lungs.

Kelley gets on-going testing at the Lions Children's Hearing Clinic.
