'Just ask!'

One of the hot topics for this time of year is "Will March come in like a lion or a lamb? Weather wise, I sure hope our lamb-like weather continues. But for OUR Lions Club purposes, let's have March come in with a ROAR!

This is a perfect time of year to think about what can we do different this year:

• How can we attract more new, perhaps younger, members? • Is there an opportunity for a new club or a branch club in our

- area?
- Maybe a specialty club would work?
- What can we do this year to shake things up a bit?
- Maybe the excuse we've always done it that way needs to be tossed out?
- What if we.....? (insert your own idea here).

• What would happen if each of your members asked just one new person to come to a meeting or participate in a service project?

- What other organizations can we partner with in our community?
- Is there an organization in our town that could also become a partner with our Lions club?

IP Dr. Patti Hill has challenged us to move our membership to 1.5 million Lions by 2027. Let's get started now! In our Multiple District we have clubs that are virtual because they are in downtown Minneapolis and meet over lunch. No one had time for a in-person meeting so they have a Zoom call instead. Yet they do many service projects and fund raisers.

I know of another club that started as a bicycle club and now are a Lions club too!

In our 5M4 District, we have a club made up of Special Olympians. I speak of them often on my club visits. I'm so impressed with their enthusiasm and how many new members I am hearing that they are recruiting just by talking about being a Lion! Is there a Special Olympics group in your town? We could help you speak with them and help them become Lions!

We will soon be talking to folks from a large dairy in West Central Minnesota. I was approached by a social worker who knew I was involved with Lions. She told me that the employees were hungry to become part of the community and be of some kind of service. We are talking with the employer about who are the right key people to help us establish a Lions club and maybe even a Leo's Club too at their location. This company has multiple locations so it might be more than one club!

• Who are your largest employers? Is there a business in your community that could help you organize a club?

• Is there a college or university you could contact and sponsor a club? Remind them how great it looks on a resume to have been part of the largest service organization in the world!

• Is there an opportunity for a Leo's club in your town? It can be school based or community based.

What is the big summer event in your community? Could you set up a booth for your club and provide information to your community about the service projects you have worked on and about Lions in general? What a great chance to do KidSight screening and attract new families by providing that wonderful service to them. Find yourself a fish house for an instant dark room and you're ready to start screening! Let our KidSight folks know so they can reserve the cameras for you. (See our cabinet list elsewhere in this newsletter).

Partner with your local law enforcement on a "Bike Rodeo" where kids can bring their bikes to get checked over by a police officer for safety, tire pressure, etc. They can set up cones for an obstacle course. Maybe partner with the law enforcement on giving away bike helmets. Perhaps the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts could help. Lots of options – all of which will attract young families. Have some door prizes and maybe a raffle for a new bike?

Maybe the same type of project as above but for baby car seats in cars. Are they up to code? Have they been installed correctly? Are they the correct size for the child? Every new parent I know has needed help with this. We have a whole team of people just waiting to come help you start a new club or sponsor a membership event. Just contact me and we'll take it from there. We also have LCIF Grants available to help assist with membership!

If all the above seems too much - start small. Just wear your Lion pin wherever you go and you'll be surprised how many people notice and share that they are a Lion too, or ask what that pin is for, or maybe just say they like your pin and how can they get one? Either way, you've started the conversation! Just ask!

- Blankets for patients at infusion center Sauk Centre Lions
- Fruit Baskets for random deliveries Sturgeon Lake Lions (5M8)
- Build ramps for people wheelchair bound Pierz Lions (5M8)
- Making beds for children who don't have one Tracy Lions (5M3)

The Tracy Lions make bedframes and deliver them to children in need. The club makes the beds and assembles them. They provide sheets, pillows and a mattress for the bed. County Social workers contact them and let them know if someone is in need. They deliver it to the address given by the Social Worker. They figure the cost of all these items is \$303. They have received donations from Slumberland for mattresses and wood from a local lumber company to decrease these costs more. They have another club doing this also in District 5M3 and as a district done 53 beds since last spring.

It was a lot of fun seeing many of you at our District Mid-Winter convention in January in Wlllmar. it was a wonderful weekend. Congratulations DG Sue, Lions Craig and Lori Schelberg and everyone involved in planning it. Thank you everyone for your support of LCIF.

\$11,160 was collected for LCIF and an additional \$2,000 for tables to the LCIF Gala coming up in April.

Congratulations to Robert Bliss from the Spicer Sunrise Lions Club. His name was drawn in our raffle board fundraiser and he received \$1,000 in Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) credit at LCIF; which entitles him to receive a Progressive MJF or to bestow a MJF to someone of his choosing.

I encourage clubs and individuals to use the MJF credit you've built up and bestow a MJF to worthy candidates (doesn't even need to be a Lions member) or request a Progressive MJF for yourself.

For every \$1,000 of credit you can give out a MJF. There are multiple levels of Progressive MJF's. Contact me and I'll look up the amount of MJF credit you have available.

Some of you are very close to having \$1,000 of credit. Consider donating and getting to the next level.

Order your MJF's as soon as possible. LCIF indicates there is an 6-8 week wait time. Bring your plaque and pin to the Gala.

Don't worry. If you don't receive your MJF plaque and pin in time, there will be a MJF plaque and pin at the event that you can have your picture taken with. So sign up and join us at the Gala!

I encourage everyone that received a MJF or a PMJF this Lions year to join us at the Gala to be pinned by PIP Brianeven if you've already been pinned. No one said you can't be pinned twice.

Our district is getting noticed for the number of LCIF grants we've received in recent years. Pictures from some of these grant projects will likely be shown at the Gala. That's fantastic! Clubs that give \$5,000 or more in a Lions year receive 15% as DCG credit to use in their communities and the conditions are fairly easy to meet. This builds up until used. The district receives 15% DCG credit for monies given by the district (and also from the remaining clubs donations that didn't reach \$5,000 on their own).

I would love to share some really nice pictures of Ukraine children receiving the packs that many of you helped assemble at Multiple District convention. It's fun to see actual recipients of your efforts.

Hello Lions,

I am not very comfortable talking about myself. My passion is to motivate, inspire, and challenge Lions to be the best that they can be. But I am asking for your vote, and I have an obligation to you to show that I am qualified and worthy of that vote.

Let's talk about impact.

In 2016 we started KidSight as a Multiple District program.. I was appointed by the Council of Governors as the program manager, tasked to get the program up and running. Within a year we had raised over \$250K, bought 32 systems, and trained hundreds of Lions. I continue to lead a team of dedicated Lions as the Chair of the Board of Directors. To date, you, and your fellow Lions in our Multiple District, have screened over 178,000 kids with over 21,000



referred for follow up by an eye care professional. This program has changed thousands of lives in and out of Lions, and that is impact.

In 2019 I was selected as the Multiple District Global Leadership Team Coordinator, responsible for all the leadership training and development for our multiple district. We now offer 2 Leadership Institutes each year rather than 1 every other year. ELLI, Emerging Lions Leadership Institute, designed for Lions who have not been a club president to help build stronger clubs. And RLLI, Regional Lions Leadership Institute, designed to give our Lions enhanced leadership skills. RLLI is truly a "leadership incubator". Since 2011, the earliest year that I have records for, 502 Lions have attended of that number 100 or 20% have been or will be a District Governor. That's impact. So, that is some of what I have accomplished in our multiple district. Outside of our multiple I have:

• Facilitated 6 RLLIs, 4 Advanced Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI), 4 Faculty Development Institute (FDI), plus one local FDI in California and Wisconsin.

• I have earned the Lions Certified Instructor designation (LCIP), the highest instructor qualification awarded by Lions International and have facilitated 2 LCIP Institutes.

• I have been entrusted by the last 3 International Presidents, Doug Alexander, Brian Sheehan and Dr. Patti Hill with the training of their incoming District Governors as a District Governor Elect Group Leader, one of 30 Lions from around the world, tasked with this important responsibility.

• I am on the faculty of Lions University and have presented at 7 USA/Canada Leadership Forums.

But what do I offer you and the International Board as a member? There are 10 major committees where a director can serve. I believe, based on my business and Lions experience, that I can add value to 6 of these committees.

Finance, Leadership Development, Marketing, Membership Operations and Services, Membership, and Service Activities, But these are not the most important reasons I would like to serve on the board, I want to serve to represent you. To be your voice, to carry your questions and concerns to the highest levels of our association. To be able to help our districts solve local problems and provide guidance and motivation to our Lions and our leaders. I would not have been able to accomplish any of this without a dedicated service partner, a Lion who can hold her own on any stage, the love of my life, my Lion Cheryl. Together we will work hard to make you proud as your representative on the International Board.

We need your support. Please plan on attending the Multiple District Convention in Winnipeg April 19-21 as a voting delegate. Together we can make our association the envy of all other service organizations in the world.

A "Lions Alert Program" is being developed within our District.



The Objective: "Preparedness, Response, Recovery, and Relief in relation to a disaster, means measures taken during or immediately after a disaster in order to bring relief to people and communities affected by the disaster".

• **PREPAREDNESS** involves the development of a plan of action in case of emergency. A logistic operations center and a practiced emergency response plan are two elements of the preparedness phase. Lions Clubs continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercise, evaluation and improvement activities to ensure effective coordination and the enhancement of capabilities to respond to incidents or disasters.

• **RESPONSE** includes the mobilization of Lions Clubs and Lions Alert Coordinators. They should be prepared to do a rapid needs assessment and bring Lions to where they can do the most good.

• **RECOVERY** aims to restore the affected area to its previous state, such as rebuilding destroyed property, infrastructure. Recovery can be immediate and/or can be longer term depending on the situation.

Relief can come in the form of providing food and drink to recovery workers and affected people, working with other agencies, assistance in long term recovery.

Communication

Our first phase of the program will be communication. We need to develop a plan of communicating the program information to our clubs. This will happen through a variety of means:

- District Leadership
- Cabinet members
- PDGs
- Zone Chairs
- Newsletter
- Leadership meetings with clubs
- Meeting with non-Lions organizations

2. Club Participation

We will begin to roll this out immediately. Each Lions Club meeting should include the following discussion: 1. Focus of the plan

- 2. Structure of the program
- 3. Develop a leader in each club (or neighboring club if none available in all clubs)
- 4. Develop a call chain template in case of emergency to muster membership
- 5. Develop a list of members who are willing to go through training
- 6. Organize training sessions for Lions to become prepared for emergencies
- 7. Develop a list of resources available already and contact names (equipment, generators, tools, capabilities, storage, etc.)
- 8. Work with local Emergency Management Directors so they know of our availability and capabilities

3. Types of Emergencies

• LEVEL ONE: A local emergency. House fire, flood, lost child, are some examples. A single club could respond to the affected area. Each club will develop their own plan on how to help their community.

• LEVEL TWO: Affects a larger geographical area, flooding, fires, or storm damage. At this level, Districts would respond and may possibly be eligible for a LCIF Emergency Grant. Our District will develop a plan for response, capabilities, and communication depending on what each local club is willing to provide.

 LEVEL THREE: Catastrophic event such as earthquake, tsunami, or large tornado affecting a huge area and thousands of people.

This is just the start of the Lions Alert Program in our District. First, communicating the information to the Leadership and then the clubs. From here, the rest of the program will be defined and implemented. Each club or Zone could develop their own plan according to their capabilities and their needs. They must work with local Emergency Management and First Responders to maximize their contribution. We will also work to have each club insured properly and be able to provide proof of insurance to local command centers on site. Our hope is to eventually have a mobile c ommand unit stocked with equipment need to provide assistance and relief in case of emergency, both short and long term.




