Dodge led the Uptown Lions Club of Detroit in establishing a school to train guide dogs for people who are blind or visually impaired.

Can Do Canines invites you to attend an open house on Saturday, March 8, from noon to 2 p.m., at its Can Do Canines campus (9440 Science Center Drive, New Hope, Minnesota). Potential volunteers, clients, or anyone who might be interested in supporting the organization can join us to learn how an assistance dog changes the life of a person with a disability.

Through a self-guided tour, attendees will be able to watch a trainer working with an assistance dog, hear from a volunteer dog host, talk with staff members from the volunteer department, pose questions to client services coordinators about the application process, and meet graduate teams from five types of areas Can Do Canines trains dogs: hearing, mobility, seizure, diabetes, and childhood autism.

There is no pre-registration for this event, though attendees will be asked to share some contact information when arriving.

Lions Clubs International – Partnerships Matter!

"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much."— Helen Keller

How many of you have heard this Helen Keller quote before? This is one of the most quoted statements from a pivotal person in Lions Clubs International history. While this quote does describe the importance of Lions joining together to provide service to our communities and beyond,



this insightful statement can also apply to how we Lions interact with others in our towns and globally.

All Lions clubs have groups and organizations in their communities that perform similar duties (service projects, fundraisers, community outreach, etc.). Many of these organizations we easily recognize (Rotary, Jaycees, Knights of Columbus, Kiwanis, Masons). We all know the youth-oriented organizations in our area (Leos, Scouts, youth sports teams, school teams & clubs). You also know of other groups that are active in your community (Firefighters, Police, City staff, Medical center staff, Professionals associations, Homeless shelters, Food shelves, etc.).



All of these various organizations are potential partners for your Lions club events and service projects. In addition, partnering with these other groups may provide you with opportunities to help those organizations with their community events and projects, or the possibility to collaborate on new community activities & fundraisers.

Make sure your Lions club reaches out to other community groups when promoting your events & projects. Develop a partnership with these organizations to help in the planning, promoting, and execution of these events. See if you can utilize the other organization's marketing contacts to help in promoting your individual and joint projects. Spend time meeting with these groups to learn about what they do in the community and how they do things when organizing and operating their projects. You may learn tips on how to better your own projects.

LCIF Update

Hurricane Helene

The Wake of Hurricane Helene: LCIF's Response to the Devastating Storm

In late September 2024, families were plunged into darkness when Hurricane Helene tore through the southeastern United States. This storm was the deadliest to strike the U.S. mainland since Hurricane Katrina in 2005, causing severe destruction and heartbreak. Knowing these victims had a long and painful road to recovery ahead of them, LCIF approved 14 grants totaling US\$380,000 in response to Hurricane Helene. This includes 12 Emergency Grants of US\$15,000 each across Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee, plus two Major Catastrophe Grants of US\$100,000 each awarded to North Carolina and Florida. These grants helped Lions provide things like water, food, cleaning supplies, toiletries, flashlights and linens.

The essential supplies and physical assistance go a long way in rebuilding the community, but for many, the emotional support can be just as effective. District 35-I District Governor Patty Jean Strong says, "It's not just about the material goods because those things are transient. They need humanity and empathy, and that's what we give."

Raging wildfires in California destroy entire communities

Several destructive wildfires swept through the Los Angeles area of California in the United States are devastating entire communities. More than 28 people have died, and more than 180,000 people have been evacuated.

The fires have burned over 50,000 acres and destroyed more than 16,000 structures, including homes, displacing countless families.
