A "Lions Alert Program" is being developed within our District.

The Objective: "Preparedness, Response, Recovery, and Relief in relation to a disaster, means measures taken during or immediately after a disaster in order to bring relief to people and communities affected by the disaster".

• **PREPAREDNESS** involves the development of a plan of action in case of emergency. A logistic operations center and a practiced emergency response plan are two elements of the preparedness phase. Lions Clubs continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercise, evaluation and improvement activities to ensure effective coordination and the enhancement of capabilities to respond to incidents or disasters.

• **RESPONSE** includes the mobilization of Lions Clubs and Lions Alert Coordinators. They should be prepared to do a rapid needs assessment and bring Lions to where they can do the most good.

• RECOVERY aims to restore the affected area to its previous state, such as rebuilding destroyed property, infrastructure. Recovery can be immediate and/or can be longer term depending on the situation.

Relief can come in the form of providing food and drink to recovery workers and affected people, working with other agencies, assistance in long term recovery.

1. Communication

Our first phase of the program will be communication. We need to develop a plan of communicating the program information to our clubs. This will happen through a variety of means:

- District Leadership
- Cabinet members
- PDGs
- Zone Chairs
- Newsletter
- Leadership meetings with clubs Meeting with non-Lions organizations

2. Club Participation

We will begin to roll this out immediately. Each Lions Club meeting should include the following discussion:

- 1. Focus of the plan
- 2. Structure of the program
- 3. Develop a leader in each club (or neighboring club if none available in all clubs)
- 4. Develop a call chain template in case of emergency to muster membership
- 5. Develop a list of members who are willing to go through training 6. Organize training sessions for Lions to become prepared for
- emergencies 7. Develop a list of resources available already and contact names
- (equipment, generators, tools, capabilities, storage, etc.) 8. Work with local Emergency Management Directors so they know of our availability and capabilities

3. Types of Emergencies

• LEVEL ONE: A local emergency. House fire, flood, lost child, are some examples. A single club could respond to the affected area. Each club will develop their own plan on how to help their community.

• LEVEL TWO: Affects a larger geographical area, flooding, fires, or storm damage. At this level, Districts would respond and may possibly be eligible for a LCIF Emergency Grant. Our District will develop a plan for response, capabilities, and communication depending on what each local club is willing to provide.

• LEVEL THREE: Catastrophic event such as earthquake, tsunami, or large tornado affecting a huge area and thousands of people.

This is just the start of the Lions Alert Program in our District. First, communicating the information to the Leadership and then the clubs. From here, the rest of the program will be defined and implemented.

Each club or Zone could develop their own plan according to their capabilities and their needs. They must work with local Emergency Management and First Responders to maximize their contribution. We will also work to have each club insured properly and be able to provide proof of insurance to local command centers on site. Our hope is to eventually have a mobile c ommand unit stocked with equipment need to

provide assistance and relief in case of emergency, both short and long term.


Before 6/15/23: Enter service activity for events prior to 6/1/23. Reporting for 6/1/23 going forward will be in the new system after conversion


Glenwood and Lowry Lions Clubs recognize 6th Grade Lions' Peace Poster artists

MINNESOTA LIONS VISION FOUNDATION

Dear Lions and Leos of Multiple District 5M:

The Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation (MLVF) wishes to thank each and every one of you for your continued support of the foundation. Your Parade of Green donations, memorial and honorary gifts, fundraising events, and legacy (deferred giving) pledges have enabled us to continue fulfilling our mission to help improve and restore sight by supporting vision related projects.

Our Annual Meeting will be held on the morning of Saturday May 6, 2023 at the MD5M Multiple Convention in St. Cloud, Minnesota. This year we have a proposed amendment to Bylaws to change the term limits of Directors and will require a vote. Each Lions Club in Minnesota, and in attendance at the annual meeting, is entitled to one vote on this proposed by-law change.

Significant events for the past year include:

• SARS-CoV-2 research: Epidemiological evaluation of SARS-CoV-2 in donor corneal tissue. .

• Automated software to evaluate endothelial cell loss in DMEK. We have developed a sophisticated software that can automatically evaluate how much damage there is in a donor cornea after it has been processed for transplantation.

• MAC Center - Dr. Glenn Lobo reported at Thanksgiving for Vision on the use of the gift of ~\$30K to the MAC center to purchase a High-Performance Liquid Chromatograph (HPLC). Dr. Lobo reported on his work on Vitamin A metabolism in the retina and its role in Macular Degeneration.

Lions Children's Eye Clinic - purchased 2 non-mydriatic (Does not require dilation) cameras. The cost for two cameras is \$35K, and an additional \$5K to integrate patient images to their electronic medical record.
Minnesota Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center: Over 12 millions recycled glasses have been collected since the start of this program.

• LifeSource: Our relationship with LifeSource continues to improve and evolve, including their participation at Thanksgiving for Vision. This strengthened relationship has led to four leaders at LifeSource joining the Minneapolis Ambassadors Lions Club.

• Legislation - The legislative effort by Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation is currently on pause due to our redeveloped partnership with LifeSource. This new level of friendship and cooperation could be derailed by the pursuit of eye banking legislation that may not have their support.
