

## A "Lions Alert Program" is being developed within our District.

The Objective: "Preparedness, Response, Recovery, and Relief in relation to a disaster, means measures taken during or immediately after a disaster in order to bring relief to people and communities affected by the disaster".

- PREPAREDNESS involves the development of a plan of action in case of emergency. A logistic operations center and a practiced emergency response plan are two elements of the preparedness phase. Lions Clubs continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercise, evaluation and improvement activities to ensure effective coordination and the enhancement of capabilities to respond to incidents or disasters.
- RESPONSE includes the mobilization of Lions Clubs and Lions Alert Coordinators. They should be prepared to do a rapid needs assessment and bring Lions to where they can do the most good.
- RECOVERY aims to restore the affected area to its previous state, such as rebuilding destroyed property, infrastructure. Recovery can be immediate and/or can be longer term depending on the situation. Relief can come in the form of providing food and drink to recovery workers and affected people, working with other agencies, assistance in long term recovery.

## Communication

Our first phase of the program will be communication. We need to develop a plan of communicating the program information to our clubs. This will happen through a variety of means:

- District Leadership
- Cabinet members
- PDGs
- Zone Chairs
- Newsletter
- Leadership meetings with clubs
- Meeting with non-Lions organizations

## 2. Club Participation

We will begin to roll this out immediately.

Each Lions Club meeting should include the following discussion:

- 1. Focus of the plan
- 2. Structure of the program
- 3. Develop a leader in each club (or neighboring club if none available in all clubs)
- 4. Develop a call chain template in case of emergency to muster membership
- 5. Develop a list of members who are willing to go through training
- 6. Organize training sessions for Lions to become prepared for emergencies
- 7. Develop a list of resources available already and contact names (equipment, generators, tools, capabilities, storage, etc.)
- 8. Work with local Emergency Management Directors so they know of our availability and capabilities

## 3. Types of Emergencies

- LEVEL ONE: A local emergency. House fire, flood, lost child, are some examples. A single club could respond to the affected area. Each club will develop their own plan on how to help their community.
- LEVEL TWO: Affects a larger geographical area, flooding, fires, or storm damage. At this level, Districts would respond and may possibly be eligible for a LCIF Emergency Grant. Our District will develop a plan for response, capabilities, and communication depending on what each local club is willing to provide.
- LEVEL THREE: Catastrophic event such as earthquake, tsunami, or large tornado affecting a huge area and thousands of people.

This is just the start of the Lions Alert Program in our District. First, communicating the information to the Leadership and then the clubs. From here, the rest of the program will be defined and implemented. Each club or Zone could develop their own plan according to their capabilities and their needs. They must work with local Emergency Management and First Responders to maximize their contribution. We will also work to have each club insured properly and be able to provide proof of insurance to local command centers on site. Our hope is to eventually have a mobile c ommand unit stocked with equipment need to provide assistance and relief in case of emergency, both short and long term.



UPDATE ON KLINGER: Klinger participated in a Leader Dog Regional 2-day training at Carrol University near Milwaukee, WI. Puppies that took part ranged in age from 8 weeks to almost 1 year. Klinger was 6 months old at the time. Puppy raisers were given tips on how to overcome individual difficulties with their puppy. All pups went through an obstacle course, obedience cues, and had lots of time practicing their settling with other dogs and temptations around. Klinger found this exhausting and slept all the way home.

#### **5M Tree Planting**



Lions International President Patti Hill has an emphasis on the environment. She will be at the Multiple District 5M Convention as the keynote speaker. With that Lions of Multiple District 5M are planning on planting 6,000 trees this spring. District 5M4 has ordered 500 trees for our District and will have them available in April or May. We will have 10 trees per club. I have ordered **White Pine, Midwest**Crabapple, Silver Maple and White Spruce. These trees will be 6-12 inches tall and grow in well-drained soil and can tolerate dry conditions. The trees come as a bare root plant and will need to be kept wet and planted within a few weeks. Please make sure the trees are taken care of for the future also. These trees can be planted on public land or private. The plan would be to bring them to a regional area to be picked up. There will be no cost for these trees.
