

Leader Dogs for the Blind - Lions Newsletter



### **September is Guide Dog Month!**

In September, we celebrate Guide Dog Month. We take this opportunity to recognize the impact guide dogs have on our clients every day, and to celebrate all the lives that touch each guide dog even before they are matched with a client.



A breeding host tickles the toes of a puppy less than 2 weeks old.

At Leader Dog, each Future Leader Dog is born in a host home. The volunteer breeding or whelping host supports the Leader Dog Mom through the first few weeks of puppy raising (no easy task for any mom!) and begin to expose the puppies in their care to new experiences. These early experiences help puppies develop the sense of curiosity and confidence they need as guide dogs. Around 7 weeks old, puppies spend 2 weeks on Leader's campus getting their initial vaccines and veterinary care. We recently published an article about the first 8 weeks of a Future Leader Dog's life in our volunteer magazine, Canine Chronicles. Email LionsSupport@leaderdog.org to receive a digital copy.

Beginning around 9 weeks old, Future Leader Dogs spend 12-14 months with volunteer puppy raisers. Some are raised by one individual, some spend 6 months in one home and 6 in another, some are raised in our Prison Puppy program, and some are raised by groups. In this year, they learn to be great dogs and experience as many environments as possible to continue developing their curiosity and confidence.

Lion Linda Lindeman-DeCarlo began raising puppies with Leader Dogs for the Blind about 22 years ago. Rusty, the 19<sup>th</sup> dog she raised, is working in Utah. Read the story in St George News. She says, "A lot of people say, 'How are you going to give up this puppy?' ... We're not. We're not 'giving up'. We're giving back. That's what it's all about, after all these years, the friendships I've developed."

## Greetings 5M4,

As you know, part of the criteria for the Club Excellence Award is to join the world in three service projects – the first one is Mental Health and Well-Being, coming up on October 4-12th. I have worked with 2B Continued (www.2bcontinued.org) in the past and support their mission – suicide prevention, mental health, and wellness. In light of the upcoming service project week that has been set, I have reached out to Tammy Diehn, Founder and Executive Director, to offer a few options for your communities. Their mission is to increase awareness of suicide prevention, mental health and wellness through advocacy, education and outreach. Those at high risk are middle age men, elderly, and those in rural areas.

> The following four trainings are offered for your consideration.

**OPR Training - Question, Persuade, and Refer** is evidence-based training designed to help individuals recognize the warning signs of suicide and take action to prevent it. This class is 2 hours, and the class limit is 40 inperson, and 20 per Zoom.

### The Anxious Generation Presentation

- teaches us about our youth, and how cell

phones and social media impacts their mental health. This presentation gives us knowledge, so we have a better understanding. This is a 2 hour presentation and there is no class limit.

<u>Changing the Narrative</u> – this presentation gives us vast knowledge in conjunction with the MN Department of Health. It touches on Suicide Prevention, Safe Language, the 8 Dimensions of Wellness, and Self Care. This is a presentation that can be scheduled on zoom and has no limits. You club could host a "watch party" for community members to join.

<u>Safe Talk for Ag</u> – this 4 hour presentation is an evidence based training and is not offered via zoom. Class size is limited to 40.

If you are in Renville or Meeker County, these trainings will be offered free of charge. All other counties will have a cost plus mileage. If you are interested in setting up a class for your community (don't forget to invite your neighboring clubs/zone, share the cost), or want to know more, please reach out to Tammy Diehn at 2B Continued, 320-854-4673 or email info@2bcontinued.org with any questions.

I have also secured "Yard Signs" with messages on them. I have 200, and they are free of charge. If your club wants any to put out in your communities or at your schools, please let me know and we can connect. Please consider using this great resource as part of your service week. Also, check out other idea's from IPDG Jacque, our Global Service Team leader in this newsletter.






### Disaster Relief Community Support & Recovery Projects

- Community Resource Hubs: Establish or volunteer at distribution centers for food, clothes, and emergency information.

  encourage talking openly about mental health.
- Guest Speaker Series: Invite local therapists, counselors, or people with lived experience to share stories and resources.
- Wellness Resource Guide: Compile a booklet or digital guide of local hotlines, therapists, and self-care
  apps.



### Support & Care

- Wellness Care Kits: Assemble kits with journals, herbal teas, cozy socks, calming scents (lavender), stress balls, or art supplies.
- Peer Support Groups: Organize safe spaces where teens, veterans, or parents can talk and connect.
- Cards of Encouragement: Write uplifting notes for patients in psychiatric hospitals, recovery homes, or nursing facilities.
- Companion Calls: Coordinate phone calls or video chats with isolated seniors or homebound individuals.

### Creative & Expressive

- Art for Healing Projects: Create murals, host art nights, or distribute coloring books that promote
  positivity.
- Music & Movement: Organize yoga, dance, or music therapy sessions for stress relief.
- Storytelling Projects: Collect and share anonymous mental health journeys (through blogs, videos, or a wall of hope).

#### School & Youth Focus

- "Mindful Mondays": Lead weekly meditation or breathing sessions for students.
- De-Stress Corners: Set up a cozy spot at school or community centers with puzzles, fidgets, and calming activities.
- Buddy Programs: Pair younger students with older mentors for emotional support and connection.

### Community & Environment

- Wellness Walks / Hikes: Plan group walks in nature to encourage movement and connection.
- Community Garden: Grow fresh produce, herbs, and flowers—great for both nutrition and mental
  well-being.
- Random Acts of Kindness Week: Encourage volunteers to do daily small acts—compliments, free hugs (if welcome), or kindness notes.

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Local news is for everyone! The Lions Reading Program for the Visually and Physically Impaired provides a means for the visually and physically impaired to be kept informed by the hearing of local newspapers read and broadcast through online, through an app, or your smart speaker.

The Lions Reading Program for the Visually and Physically Impaired started with an event the Fergus Falls area in 1992. Lion John Bloom wrote a Letter to the Editor of the Fergus Falls Daily Journal explaining the thing he missed most when he lost his sight was walking into the cafe in the morning and discussing what the local newspaper had to say about local issues. He asked if there was any way they could fill that gap.

Interested people in Fergus Falls including an editor of the newspaper, State

Services for the Blind, and representatives of the local Lions Clubs got together and the program was developed. In the next few months, readers were tested and trained. A small transmitter unit was made and installed in a room furnished by Bethlehem Lutheran Church. On April 1, 1993, the first broadcast of The Daily Journal went on the air with special radios that picked up the transmission. We now celebrate the 28th year of our program.

The broadcast has expanded to include local weekly newspapers from: Battle Lake, Frazee, Vergas, Grant County, Henning, New York Mills, Parkers Prairie, Pelican Rapids, and Perham. The broadcast, as of this year, it is available through your computer, online at Radio Talking Book Minnesota/ State Services for the Blind.

Volunteers are the heart of the program! An hour of broadcasting takes place Monday through Saturday at 7pm due to the commitment of much appreciated volunteers: Lions and others from the public. Volunteers read with a partner and they dedicate 2 hours, in one evening, each month, for preparation and reading to our listeners. This reading program is very cost effective because of many hours of volunteer time.

We are in need of volunteers. Any interested people can contact Lion Ginny

Paulson (218-736-5109) or Pamela Shroden (218-731-2954). It is an easy and important way to make a wonderful difference in our communities.

This is a nonprofit organization. It is governed by representatives from Riverside Fergus Falls Lions Club, Elizabeth Lions Club, consumers, and readers.

We and our listeners are very thankful for the support of our communities!
