

'These are unusual times...'

This is certainly not the 5M4 Newsletter article I thought I'd be writing during my tenure as District Governor, but these are unusual times.

We are being challenged with something the likes we have never seen. We are being asked to completely turn our lives around and change everything we know. Our routines have become something unfamiliar to us. But yet, as Americans - and as Lions - we press on and continue to serve our communities.

We have received a directive from Lions International to cancel or postpone all meetings, events, conventions, and other gatherings that would exceed the 10 person limit. We have had a conference call and as District Governors we voted unanimously to cancel the Multiple District Convention in Rochester. As we speak, the Convention Chair and Host Committee are negotiating with the Mayo Convention Center and the Kahler Hotel on the best way to refund registrations. There may be a small handling fee for the processing but that is yet to be determined. We have also just received information that the International Convention in Singapore has also been cancelled.

I will not be able to schedule any Club visits for the time being and must cancel the visits already scheduled. Luckily I only have 8 clubs left, including the two Leos clubs in our District. I promise I will come to each and every one of those clubs even if it's after my term as District Governor is up.

While the "social distance" will change how we live for a while, there is no reason we can't continue to serve our communities in other ways. Look around you and see what you, as Lions, can do.

- Can your club organize food delivery from the local grocery store?
- Can you offer to bring meals from local restaurants many are offering drive through or pick up service.
- Do you have a neighbor who is not having regular contact with anyone? Give them a call, write them a note, or go visit through the front door.
- Is there a senior living center that needs assistance? Ask what you can do to help. Maybe your club could send cards or letters to the residents. How about putting up bird feeders where the residents can enjoy them?
- Is there an animal shelter that needs a food delivery or perhaps you could foster a dog or cat for a while.
- Is there a project you could work on at home during this time?
- Can you support those who continue to work while this virus continues to spread? Healthcare workers, retail employees, first responders of all kinds, truck drivers and others who could use your support. Make some cookies or cupcakes and drop them off, bring them food from local restaurants, offer to watch their children, or just send them a note or email thanking them for their service. We've even seen lunches served at rest stops.

• BUY LOCAL AND SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESSES! This will be the hardest time for the small business owner who is struggling with whether or not to be open, what to do about their employees, and how will they pay their bills. Support them like never before!

This is the time when all of us, as Lions, can show our communities that we continue to serve them. Continue to be the Leaders of your communities. As we navigate our way through this crisis, please know that we - the Leaders of your District - are here for you and available to help in any way we can.


