And to Lion Mike Dengate of Leader Dog for working hard all weekend and putting on our "Dining in the Dark" for the Leos. And to all of you - who participated in our "Santa's Workshop" blanket tying project. We completed 197 blankets and auctioned off a few that didn't get done to raise even more funds. 100 blankets will be donated to the University of MN Children's Cancer Center, 25 blankets will be going to the Ronald McDonald House, the remainder were divided up among the clubs who helped make blankets to take home and distribute as they wished. Some ideas were to give them to local hospitals, sheriff's department, fire department, and Foster Family organizations.

Again, thanks to everyone who help us, who attended, and we hope you will support DGE Kellie Knutson in her convention next year.



#### LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The Lions International Trading Pin Club (LITPC) has announced for the 2019 - 2020 school year that there will be 3 US \$2,500 scholarships awarded. Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of Lions or Lioness are eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The LITPC goal is to help our future leaders and give students a financial helping hand. Last year the recipients were from Minnesota, Ohio and Oklahoma. The 2020 recipients will be announced at the LITPC Pin Traders Annual Breakfast in June, 2020.

Selection of the scholarship recipients will be based on academic achievement, an essay stating the student's goals, a statement of reason(s) for applying and an overview of work, community and school service, and letters of recommendation.

The current forms for the scholarships are available on line at www.litpc. org In the right column, click on LITPC Scholarship Information. Then click on Scholarship Application Form. Please follow the instructions, fill out ALL the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a certified copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) AND attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located.
