

Support the Childhood Cancer team

March often brings high school tournaments - and often the blizzards that go with them. Let's hope that's not the case this year.

We always enjoy following the teams from within our District and cheer on the teams where we know we have Lions Clubs. It is so great to see these young people working so hard for their success. They have put in hours of training for both the physical and mental toughness to reach state tournament level. But then, we are reminded that some kids don't have the opportunity to participate in sports, school, or even family life in general due to illness such as Childhood Cancer.

A child is diagnosed with cancer EVERY TWO MINUTES! Each year 300,000 children are diagnosed with cancer. 6 years old is the average age for a cancer diagnosis. There has been a 13% increase in childhood cancer over the past 20 years.

We focused on the new Childhood Cancer Foundation that we are supporting throughout our Mid-Winter Convention and it has opened our eyes to what this devastating disease can do to a child and their family. In addition to raising almost \$17,000, we also tied blankets most of which went on to be donated to the Children's Cancer Center at the University of Minnesota. They were thrilled with the blanket donation and would welcome more if your club would like to become part of that project.

If any of you heard one of our morning speakers at the Convention, Tatum Libbesmeier shared her story of being diagnosed with retinal blastoma (a tumor in her eye) when she was 7 years old. She is now 14 and has been cured through surgery, chemo, and radiation. She did NOT lose her eye and her vision is 20/50 in that eye. She has a contact lens implanted to improve her vision and has to wear goggles when she plays sports - but that's a small price to pay. Tatum and her dad, Scott, told the story of their journey through cancer and how the Lions Club helped support them both at Children's Hospital and also locally with fund raisers to help with the expenses. Many Lions shared with us that this family sharing their story was the most moving and, I might even say, the best presentation of the weekend.

We can continue this journey of hope and help for other families. Right now we are in the middle of raising funds to achieve a matching grant that will double our donation. If you are considering a fund raising event, or have some extra funds raised without a specific purpose, consider Childhood Cancer as the Foundation to donate to. 
