

A personal tale of COVID-19

Wow what a October it has been. On September 27th I came down with what I thought was a bad cold. Monday, I woke up feeling terrible, but no fever. I called my Doctor was advised to go online to Centra Care fill out the online assessment and follow that. What a procedure that turned out to be. This is a very thorough auestioner. I had to fill out online to see if I should call in or not. It is very specific, and well done, easy to follow. We called the clinic number and were put on hold for 1 hour and 38 minutes before we got to talk to anyone. (They are extremely busy and take their time with each person - very comforting when you finally get through). At that point I was asked a series of questions. I was then given a very specific test time. I was told to be at the test at 2:05 not 2:00 and not 2:08. The exact time of 2:05. I was told to call a phone number and stay in my vehicle. When I arrived at 2:05 I called and the nurse verified my name came out and looked at my Drivers License and took my test. She did indicate that they were very busy and the next person was scheduled in 5 minutes. (that is why it is so important to be at time slot, there is little time for error) She indicated that test would be sent

to the Mayo clinic and it takes 3-8 days to get the results. I was told to monitor my chart, that is where it would be put first. So now the wait begins. Since going in to get tested, my symptoms had gotten worse, and I had developed a fever. I was told to do what I can to relieve the symptoms - like take Tylenol and vitamins and decongestants, until my results came back. Well on Wednesday I received the news I was Positive for COVID 19. My chart indicated I would be contacted by multiple agencies MDH, Stearns county. I was directed on what to do next with quarantine and general directions.

I received the first call on Thursday from the Minnesota Dept. of Health. They again asked a series of very specific questions. They told me who to contact, and who to advise I was with. How to properly separate within our house and what we should and shouldn't do. They also gave us contact info and website to use for information.

On Friday I was contacted by the Stearns County Health dept. given similar information but not exact. Like the number of days to be symptom free before returning to society, and the definition of body temp. Small things but different information. Over time, my symptoms changed. Over all, I had a fever for 16 days. I had a extreme headache and body aches for over two weeks. On Saturday, October 10th, my symptoms took a turn for the worse. I was having a hard time breathing I could no longer focus. My headache had gotten so bad and I was nauseous. I went into the emergency room where they treated me for 5 hours. I had multiple complications due to COVID 19. I was isolated for additional 7 days, making now 20 days of quarantine. My wife was cleared to go back to work.

Without mixing any words... this sucks!! I was starting feel pretty good and then my wife tested positive with no symptoms. (Her employer required her test before returning to work). So here we go again. We contacted the Minnesota Department health on what to do now. The CDC states I should not have to quarantine, since I had it and have recovered from symptoms. The Minnesota Department of Health stated best practice is now to quarantine since information is changing on how the virus is reacting. At one time the thought was, once you have it you can't get it back like chicken pox. Well that has been proven wrong multiple times now. They also stated that after you have it, you are good for 90 days, well that has changed also. Unfortunately, this virus is new and the doctors and researchers are learning a lot about it every day. So, what we thought we knew yesterday may be different tomorrow. In my mind they are doing a great a job, I just wish they were more consistent with their recommendations.

My wife and I are doing great now I will have been in quarantine for a total of 29 days before we are back in society.

I will keep my thoughts to myself about masks and social distancing. But I will say, someone more informed than me is making these recommendations. So if there is anything you think you can do to stay healthy do it. Because I don't wish this experience on anyone.

As of the position of G.L.T. I am working on coming up with training for clubs. I am also working on writing a description of all positions of cabinet. This has been done in the past in other districts so I am conferring with them also on what works and what doesn't, no since in reinventing the wheel.

Second Vice District Governor training was interesting to say the least. I was unable to attend since I was still in quarantine for COVID 19. I did attend online both days, and I did learn a lot. I missed out of in-person one on one interactions. Hoping to start to be able to club visits soon.



Lion Sue Kulbeik honored with Leader Dog award

Sue Kulbeik was honored with the prestigious 'Leader Dogs for the Blind Founders Tribute' award at the Elbow Lake Lions club meeting held at Athletic Park recently. The award is presented to those who are dedicated to the strong tradition of support for the Leader Dog program. There are over 16,000 Leaders Dogs in service that have been trained under the Lions program. The program began in 1939 when three Lions from Detroit Michigan had a hard time finding a guide dog for a friend of theirs who was blind. Their dream of providing dogs to those in need has grown into one of the largest and most innovative guide dog schools in the world. Each year your hometown Lions club donates to this program. Sue and Bob have been involved in the program for many years - raising puppies who are now helping blind people all over the world. Recently Sue helped out Scott Hauge and his Leader Dog, Travers, by starting a 'Rehab the Lab' group. The purpose of the group was to help Travers not be afraid of other dogs after he was attacked and injured by one earlier this year. Sue had great response from area dog owners who brought their dogs to spend time with Traverse to help him understand that not all other dogs are to avoided. The plan was successful and now Travers is not afraid anymore. This is just one example of Sue's dedication to the program. The award was presented to Sue by her husband, Past District Governor Bob Kulbeik who had been keeping it a secret for many months!

Scott Hauge and his family were guests at the Lions club meeting. Scott has 'Travers,' a Lion's trained Leader Dog who is his constant companion. Scott told of two instances when Travers prevented him from being hit by a car. He gratefully thanked the Lions for their dedication to the Leader Dog program - and said, "it changed his life." When one of the Lions asked, "what is the dog like when off-harness? - We noticed that he didn't even flinch when a squirrel ran past!" Scott then removed the harness and Travers transformed into a 'regular' energetic dog. When the harness was put back - he became a calm and focused Leader Dog at work. It was amazing. Scott was not a Lions member when he originally got Travers. But he was so appreciative that he joined his local (Fergus Falls) club and is now serving as President of the Club and plans to keep on dedicating his time and talent to the Lions organization.

Advanced Lions Leadership Institute

Advanced Lions Leadership Institutes focus on building the skills of Lions leaders to prepare them for leadership responsibilities at zone, region, and district levels. Qualified candidates are Lions that have completed a successful term as club president but have not yet attained the position of First Vice District Governor. Candidates must be willing to commit to all days of the institute.

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the dates and schedule of the institute. Please note that a non-refundable participation fee of US\$125.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs for all institutes. Participants are also responsible to pay for their own transportation and other travel related expenses to and from the institute site.

Faculty Development Institute (FDI)

The Faculty Development Institute is a three-day institute that serves to develop and expand the number of skilled Lions faculty available for use in training at the club, district, and multiple district levels. The curriculum is designed to enhance training delivery skills and training techniques that will increase the quality of training and overall effectiveness of Lions leadership development programs. Lions who complete the FDI are expected to be able to effectively deliver training sessions with provided materials. They should not be expected to create their own training materials.

Qualified candidates are those Lions who have some experience as instructors at local Lions training events, have demonstrated basic instructional skills, and have a keen interest in further developing those skills. A candidate's training experience should include using PowerPoint to support training delivery. (Note: Participants will not be expected to create any materials while at the FDI, but it will be necessary to use PowerPoint and other provided materials for some activities. Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the dates and schedule of the institute. In compliance with board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of US\$150.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs. Participants are also responsible to pay for their own transportation and other travel related expenses to and from the institute site.

For the first time in her life, she no longer drags her leg slightly, she is able to ride bike without shaking and she no longer gets car sick.

The first time she read out loud for her mom while wearing the glasses, was the first time her mom had ever

heard her read with no stutter, skipping words, stumbling on simple phrases.

Ella has also adjusted to writing on purple lined paper, and getting her homework, worksheets and other assignments on paper.

At home, Ella has also become a much different child, she is now more calm, listens better, is more willing to do her chores and overall has built a self confidence that was never there before.

We are so appreciative to the Benson Lion's Club that helped us and to everyone else involved in her Irlen's journey, and we cannot express how blessed to have found a solution to help her succeed in life in ways not possible before the glasses.
