



LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

Dear Lion members in District 20-R2!

Thank you very much to the LCIF Co-chairs and Advisors and Lions Club members in District 20-R2. We worked together as a team last year (2015-16) and with your strong support, our District always has been No. 1 contributor to LCIF in MD-20 including last year. 27 Clubs out of 48 contributed to LCIF in 2015-16 (\$30.00-\$7,000.00). Thank you for your support.

Lions Clubs International Project, Measles Initiative Project (One Dollar, One Shot and One Life Saved) is a (4) year project that started in 2013 when PDG Maria Sierra was inducted as DG in Hamburg, Germany and this year is the last year to meet our fundraising goal of \$30 million and matching funds: \$30 million from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and International Developing Dept. of the United Kingdom.

Lions around the world have to raise about \$8M in 2016-2017 to reach our goal to save 700 million children. This year our LCIF Committee goal is \$40,000 and we will work together as a team to reach our goal as before.

A catastrophe, Hurricane Matthew category 4 hit in Haiti and the South East coast of the United States. It was the country's worst humanitarian crisis which destroyed homes, flooded villages, raised crops, swept away cattle and cut off parts of an island where there were 842 deaths in Haiti and the storm surge was measured at more than 4 feet which left more than 1 million people without power in Florida and Matthew was hovering off the coast of Georgia headed toward South Carolina.

Your donation to help our fellow Lions in Haiti and the South East part of the United States will provide both short term and long term humanitarian assistance during the grave time of need.

A TRIBUTE TO OUR DEAR LION HARRY KATZ, PDG 1931 - 2016

Lion Harry joined the Lions club of the Bronx in April 1972. Prior to his induction, he had assisted the club for a number of years at their annual Beefsteak activity.

When he officially became a Lion, he was a licensed electrical contractor who had recently established his own business in the Bronx. His partner Lee and he were at the time raising three young sons.

Harry was a proud Army Veteran of the Korean War and remained a steadfast member of the VFW for his entire life. In the same manner, he was a life-long member of the Knights of Pythias and generously supported his Temple.

Lion Harry was elected President of the Lions Club of the Bronx for the Lion year 1977-78, the same year that the club celebrated their 65th anniversary.

During his tenure, The Bronx Lions purchased a mini-bus for the Bronx YMCA, donated an Endo-laser to the Ophthalmology Department of Montefiore Hospital and provided many thousands of dollars for teacher training and student materials for the Lions Quest program. Warehouse was also provided to the Salvation Army in order for them to expand their food distribution efforts and so much more.

In 1992 Harry was elected District Governor of 20-R2. Many projects were completed and Lion Harry became involved with Lions Day at the United Nations and year after year he assisted the presidents of Lions International in coordinating this event. It was not long before he was awarded the Lions highest honor, being named an Ambassador of Good Will

When the Twin Towers fell in 2001, he immediately provided electrical backups to the trailers in the area that sheltered workers as well as the dogs that were vital to locating victims.

He and Lion Lee shared more than 60 years of marriage. Lion Lee went on to become a most vibrant District Governor for the Lion year 2000-2001.

The Lions and so many others were blessed by a life that was so well spent.

"THE LION DISTRICT GOVERNOR WITH A GREAT SENSE OF HUMOR"

The following are excerpts from a recent interview conducted with Eleanor Carreon, the beloved partner in service and wife of 63 years of our beloved fellow Lion Felipe "Philip" Carreon, District 20-R2 Governor (the first Filipino-American District Governor in the whole United States), who passed away on Monday, October 3, 2016 at the age of 83 with his beloved Eleanor by his side.

We met at a Philippine dance class and fell in love. We got married not too long after in 1954 when I was 17 years old and he was 20. Philip was born in Ilocos in the northern part of the island of Luzon in the Philippines. Although I was not born in the Philippines, my family hails from La Union, which is a neighboring province.

Philip was an accountant and worked with several divisions of the City Government of New York. He worked in several locations but spent a great deal of his tenure in Riker's Island.

He was one of the senior members of the New York Phil-Am Lions Club. He joined the club only two years from its founding. If I remember correctly, he decided to run for the District Governorship of 20-R2 in 1991 and I supported him wholeheartedly. I was even the editor of his district newsletter at that time.

Philip greatest legacy as the District Governor was his support for programs for the children. The children of New York meant a lot to him and he pushed to fund activities that benefited a lot of children and he was genuinely pleased to see them happy. We had fund drives to raise money for gifts to children even in foreign countries and especially during Christmas.

He was a very happy go lucky person besides being helpful and taking great pleasure in helping people. He was always a happy person. He knew how to manage life's curve balls. He took challenges one at a time and if something did not go his way, he would say, "well, next time". "If you can't change it, there is nothing you can do about it". He knew better than to dwell on it. He stayed true to the ideals of Lionism and was a passionate Lion. This made him very popular among the Lions. He was never angry. I don't remember seeing him angry with anybody, except perhaps when I overdid my shopping.

I would not have gone to Columbia University and gotten a degree if it was not for him pushing me to go to college.

Besides Eleanor, Lion Philip is also survived by an ailing younger brother in Hawaii.

Lion Philip will be surely missed.

The nine (9) traits that define great Leadership:

To motivate your team to achieve the highest levels of performance (and create an extraordinary organization in the process) here are the quantities you should model every day, many leaders are competent, but few qualify as remarkable. If you want to join the ranks of the best of the best, make sure you embody all these qualities all the time. It isn't easy, but the rewards can be truly phenomenal.

- (1) Awareness: There is a difference between management and employees. Bosses and workers, Leaders understand the nature of this difference and accept it; it informs their image, their actions, and their communication
- (2) Decisiveness: All Leaders must make tough decisions. It goes with the job.
- (3) Empathy: Extraordinary Leaders praise in public and address problems in private, with a genuine concern, the best Leaders guide employees through challenges, always on the lookout for solutions to foster the long term success of the organization.
- (4) Accountability: Extraordinary Leaders take responsibility for everyone's performance, including their own. They follow up on all outstanding issues, check in on employees, and monitor the effectiveness of company policies and procedures. When things are going well, they praise, when problems arise, they identify them quickly, seek solutions and get things back on track.
- (5) Confidence: Not only are the best Leaders confident, but their confidence is contagious. Employees are naturally drawn to them, seek their advice and feel more confident as a result. When challenged, they don't give in too easily, because they know their ideas, opinions and strategies are well-informed and the result of much hard work. But when proven wrong, they take responsibility and quickly act to improve the situations within their authority.
- (6) Optimism: The very best Leaders are a source of posi-

tive energy. They communicate easily, they are intrinsically helpful and genuinely concerned for other people's welfare. They always seem to have a solution, and always know what to say to inspire and reassure.

- (7) Honesty: Strong Leaders treat people the way they want to be treated. They are extremely ethical and believe that honesty, effort and reliability form the foundation of success.
- (8) Focus: Extraordinary Leaders plan ahead, and they are supremely organized. They think through multiple scenarios and the possible impacts of their decision, while considering viable alternatives and making plans and strategies-all targeted toward success.
- (9) Inspiration: Put it all together, and what emerges is a picture of the truly inspiring Leader: someone who communicates clearly, concisely, and often, and by doing so motivates everyone to give his or her best all the time. They challenge their people by setting high but attainable standards and expectation, and then giving them support, tools, training and latitude to pursue those goals and become the best employees they can possibly be.
